Principal's Report

We will be holding two important parent information sessions before the end of this term. The first will be for parents interested in enrolling children for Year 7 2011 to be held on Wednesday 24th March from 7.00pm. The second session will be for parents of our current Year 11 to be held on Tuesday 30th March from 7.00pm. Invitations to the Year 7 2011 night will be sent out through the primary schools. If you know of a parent who does not currently have a child in Year 6 at a public school who would be interested, invitations can also be picked up from Mudgee High School office or from our website.

The Year 11 evening is for both parents and students and concerns, requirements for the next two years. At that evening we will also discuss issues such as assessment, exams and work placement for VET courses. Each Year 11 student will be issued with an invitation to take home.

As part of our school evaluation each year we review an aspect of our educational management. This year we are reviewing teaching and learning. The data gathered will be reported in our Annual School Report which will be available in Term 2 on our website. This data will also assist us to evaluate the Centre for Excellence programs. A random sample of parents have been sent out a parent survey through their child. Those attending the P&C AGM on 22nd March will also be given a survey to complete. Other parents who wish to can collect a survey form from the school office. The surveys need to be returned no later than 25th March to enable the data to be collated.

Agriculture Update

Week 6 was a busy and overwhelmingly rewarding week for students of Agriculture at Mudgee

On 4th March, senior students visited Biraganbil as part of their case study requirements. This was one of the most beneficial of its kind as we were given a detailed explanation of many management practices by Elders Agronomist, Carlos Rahme. This was accompanied by inspections of the centre pivot irrigator and a brief tour of Biraganbil and Gooree pastoral enterprises. Property manager, Tony McManus spoke on some of his experiences and plans for the pastoral side of this 6600ha property. Both Carlos and Tony and their respective employers are acknowledged for their willingness to assist our students.

Friday 5th March was the day of junior judging for the Mudgee show and took in the regional finals for the older students. Once again, Bianca Stanford is to be commended for her organisation, along with members of her family who assisted on the day. The talks were informative and our students participated with eagerness in both senior and junior sections. Mudgee was well represented in the placings and several senior students qualified for NSW finals at the Royal Easter Show. Our best placed students were:

The following day was our first venture into sheep showing. Our small White Suffolk stud was represented by 10 animals and 4 junior handlers volunteered to show the animals throughout the day. While several animals received ribbons, the most pleasing result was to be awarded supreme champion meat sheep, which placed our hogget ewe as best of all meat breeds, ages and sexes. This is a much prized award and speaks highly of the genetic base and management of the livestock. On the same day, Brittnay Burns took out junior handler (13-18yo) while Kelsey Johnson was placed 3rd in the same category. The many students who have worked during lesson times to teach these animals to lead should also feel some pride in their efforts.

In other news, the horticulture section attended the local Farmer's Markets in February. This was the first occasion when we have sold plants at this market and we would like to thank everyone who supported us on the day.

Please note **Saturday 27th March** as our next plant and poultry sale in the school grounds. Further details will be published later this term. With the recent purchase of a 288 egg incubator, we are able to hatch many more eggs and should have chickens of all ages available for sale. We hope that we can offer a limited incubation facility at a reasonable cost in the near future and enquiries can be made on this day.

Please remember that sales of livestock, plants and produce are channelled back into the Agriculture unit to offset costs and provide additional facilities, many of which are available to enhance the learning experiences of students. Our sale days should also be viewed as 'open days' for the Agriculture faculty at the main school, with family invited to view the Year 8 Technology Mandatory gardens and an opportunity to ask general questions and view the facilities available to students.

Two Hereford heifer calves were also purchased recently. With current market prices, we have delayed the purchase of animals for the cattle unit. These animals will not be used for showing but should give students some experience in the management of cattle and some of the preparatory work for showing.

Looking ahead, we have a large number of students attending the Easter Show. This ever popular excursion is a highlight for many students and offers a great opportunity to experience 'City meeting Country'. This year's evening entertainment is promoted to be one of the most exciting.

Year 11 Study Skills Day

This Thursday and Friday Mudgee High will be conducting study skills sessions for Year 11 in conjunction with the Business Concierge. These sessions will cover topics such as time management, memory tips, reducing stress, syllabus language, team building, essay writing, interpreting your HSC marks and after school options. Each session will provide valuable tools for the students which will set them up for their senior studies. Normal school uniform and rules will apply throughout the two days. Business Concierge Visit

The Business Concierge Training and Development Company will visit Mudgee High School on Thursday 18th and Friday 19th March 2010. This organisation specialises in presenting topics such as budgeting, goal setting, work rights and responsibilities etc to young people in an interesting and informative manner. The sessions should also provide students with valuable decision making skills to help with future career planning.

Mudgee High School hosted Business Concierge in 2008 and found it to be valuable for our Years 10 and 11 students.

The seminars will again be available to our Years 10 and 11 students at various times over the two days mentioned above with each group of students attending for a maximum of two double periods (130 minutes). Each student will receive a workbook in which to record useful information of future reference.
