Australian Mathematics Competition

On the 5th of August this year Mudgee High School students will once again be invited to attempt the Australian Mathematics Competition. This is a test of mathematical, logical and problem solving skills involving 30 multiple choice questions. All students are encouraged to enter this competition, especially those with talent in the subject or who enjoy a challenge. All entrants receive a certificate of participation, with higher credentials for different levels of success also on offer (great certificates for resumes and CVs). Exceptionally talented students may also be in line for some of the many cash prizes available.

Although the competition is on later in the year our school entry needs to be in early next term. To enter this competition, students will need to pay \$4.50 to the front office by the end of term (Thursday 1st April). Mudgee Show Results for Danica Roberts

Danica received first place in the High School Craft section for an article using recycled material with her Purple Dragon which was on display in the School Library at the end of last year. She received a Special Award for Best Exhibit of High School Craft and the Champion Award for Best Exhibit in the Main Pavilion 2010 – Junior. Danica entered her painting of a Phoenix and received First Prize in Painting-High School and a Special Award for Best High School Art. Well done Danica.

Centre for Excellence

As part of the role of the Centre for Excellence Mudgee High School is linked with Charles Sturt University. The partnership is designed to improve the quality of programs being offered to teacher education students at the university. A core component of this development of teacher training is to obtain information and reflection from practicing teachers.

To meet the aims of this project Charles Sturt University have met with some of our staff last week and obtained audio recordings to be used in CSU lectures. They focused their interviews around such topics as: Why did you become a teacher? What are the features of a quality teacher? What teaching strategies do you use in your classroom that are beneficial to positive student outcomes? Why is your teaching subject important in secondary education? What important piece of advice would you give to a pre-service teacher?

Thanks to the staff who participated in the interviews to help develop audio resources that will be used in quality teacher education programs at Charles Sturt University. This will ultimately not only benefit graduating teachers in the future but the interviews allowed our staff to focus upon their own teaching practice which will result in a more refined and better teacher at Mudgee High School.

As part of the Cudgegong Learning Community and supported by the Centre for Excellence an outstanding day one term 2 staff development day has been organized. It is expected that more than 350 DET staff will attend Mudgee High School on that day with a outstanding guest speaker Celia Lashlie speaking about the development of boys to men with strategies to support this transition. Many workshops have also been organized with presenters coming from Dubbo, Gilgandra, Sydney and Bathurst. There are an exceptional number of workshops which will result in improved teacher quality in classroom across Western Area. There will be an article in the newsletter after the development day next term highlighting the events of the day.

Davidson Shield Cricket

On Wednesday 10th March, Mudgee High played Endeavour Sports High in the quarter finals of the Davidson Shield Cricket competition. Mudgee won the toss and elected to bat, getting off to a flyer with Troy Kenny and Michael Ford helping the team to be no wicket for 45 off the first 10 overs. Michael Ford was the first wicket to fall for a quickfire 24 with the score on 47. At this point Endeavour really put the brakes on and held Mudgee to 3 for 61 at drinks (20 overs). Shortly after drinks Captain Daniel Hiep was unluckily out off a freakish catch which deflected off a fielder's heel and into the wicket keeper's gloves for 9. Mitch Hearn then came to the crease nursing a badly injured collar bone. In a great effort he made 14 runs, batting with practically one arm. When he was out Troy Kenny shortly

followed for an excellent 32 and the score was 6 for 99. A couple more quick wickets fell until Cameron Cox steadied the ship with a solid 14 runs and got Mudgee to 9 for 123 after their 40 overs.

At the beginning of Endeavour's innings the Mudgee opening bowling pair of James McQuiggin and Daniel Wood had them reeling with a fine spell of bowling. Daniel finished with the excellent figures of 4 for 11 off 8 overs, including 4 maidens. His spell was described by the umpire, Kevin Pye, as one of the best spells of bowling he had seen by a young player. Lee Hundy and Andrew Best also bowled well to have Endeavour at 6 for 51 at drinks. After drinks Mudgee knew they still had a lot to do, however the Endeavour batsmen formed a great partnership of 79 runs, to see them win with 4 overs to spare.

Although disappointed, the boys had tried their best to the very last ball and should be proud of their achievement. This is the second year in a row they have made the final 8 of the state, only to meet a sporting high school (last year was Westfields) at this point.

As their coach I would like to congratulate them on their wonderful achievement. They have put a lot of hard work into getting where they did, training every Monday for 1 ½ hours, 20 weeks a year. They are not only a great sporting team but also a great bunch of kids and a credit to Mudgee High.
