Students Contacting Parents - The numbers of students contacting parents using their mobile phones to request items to be dropped off has significantly increased. CENTRE FOR EXCELLENCE

I am working with Leanne Besant at Kandos High School to develop a joint program for Year 11 and 12 Geography. The opportunity to work with a younger teacher with fresh new ideas and the enthusiasm of youth is great for me and I am sure that the teaching programs at Mudgee High School will be significantly enhanced by the input of Leanne. Adding her students to our virtual classroom will also be great for our students. All of our senior lessons, study guides, homework and assessment tasks are loaded onto our Moodle site. The Kandos students have been made members of this site.

On Friday 5th March Leanne and I attended a field work seminar at Homebush Bay. During this day we both learnt a lot about the type of field work that the students can complete at this facility and were able to begin the planning process for the Year 12 field work at the end of the year. Travelling to Sydney and back in the car provided us with an excellent opportunity to discuss the Year 11 Field work that Leanne is organising at Dunn's Swamp,. As part of this trip the Kandos students will come to Mudgee to spend time using our GIS software to generate maps of the region. This software is expensive and is much better utilised if used by a wide range of students.

We are also working on developing field work in the junior school and will provide her with the resources that we have developed for the Year 9 Dunn's swamp excursion. Hopefully with these small beginnings, both schools will continue to develop excellent teaching resources. *Sue Spinner*


Premier's Reading Challenge

The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is available for all NSW students in Kindergarten—Year 9. Participation by schools and students is voluntary. The Challenge aims to encourage in students a love of reading for leisure and pleasure, and to enable students to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely. Student efforts are acknowledged by participation certificates and there are additional rewards for participation over a number of years.

Students register in March and read until late August. The registration and entering of reading records is done online on the website at https://products.schools.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html The site has the rules for the challenge and a Frequently Asked Questions section which gives all the information required to be part of the challenge.

We have approximately 380 of the books on the Premier's Reading Challenge list and a great selection of free choice reading books. Students can see which of the books on the challenge list are held in our library, by clicking on the *My Library* link on the portal page, then going to *Reading Lists* and selecting the Premiers' Reading Challenge list.

The *My Library* link takes students to the library catalog. This is a great facility which allows students to see what is available in our library from home. These can then be borrowed during school hours. A graphic of the My Library site is shown here.

LANGUAGES

All Year 7 and junior elective classes and have been working their way through the programmed topics and the majority of students are applying themselves in a positive manner. Students have completed close to fifty percent of their assessment for this semester. Those that have shown a thorough understanding of the language presented have consistently applied themselves in class and have also revised their work regularly.

A great study tip for language learners is to create revision cards for the topics covered. This is particularly good for learning vocabulary and kanji/hiragana (script) characters. On one side of the card write the Japanese word and on the other write the English meaning; or the kanji/hiragana character on one side and pronunciation on the other. Punch a hole in the corner and put them on curtain rings based on themes. For example: greetings, food, activities, time etc. Students can study their cards anytime, anywhere. In fact, as little as five minutes, four times a week can make a huge difference. Parents can also help with this technique by testing their child every once and awhile. Encourage your child to help you learn the Japanese words. Teaching someone else is the best way to remember something!

Imaginations Visit

In week 7 of this term the students in Ja04/05 went on a visit to Imaginations Early Learning Centre to introduce some Japanese culture to some of the centre's children. They taught some simple classroom instructions in Japanese and reinforced these through song. Our students also took along items of clothing and traditional Japanese toys, explaining what they were called and how they were used. The group spent about an hour interacting with the preschoolers and providing an insight into Japanese life.

I was very proud of the way all Mudgee High students engaged in this experience and the way in which they conducted themselves.

Japan Visit 2011

The information evening held in week 7 was extremely well attended and provided further details on the trip and the process involved for securing a position with the tour group. The office staff were overwhelmed first thing the following morning with many students keen to submit their deposit. As a result we have now reached our total number of 30 students and are currently recording names on a waiting list. The deadline for deposits is next week and anyone still wishing to register their interest needs to see Miss Hutchins or Ms Date to add their name. No deposit is necessary for those going on the waiting list at the moment. Final decisions on the make-up of the group will be made at the beginning of term 2.

This is an amazing opportunity for students and all those who embark on this unique learning experience will not only gain a far better understanding and awareness of cultural differences, but also empathy for citizens of a different culture. The cultural benefits of this experience can never be replicated in the classroom and will be translated into a far greater understanding of the nuances of the Japanese discourse and cultural heritage. Students will not only improve their language skills, but they will also learn many interpersonal skills that come with travelling with a group. They will learn to budget their spending money and demonstrate a high level of personal responsibility.

This will possibly be the first overseas experience for many of the students and most certainly the first visit to Japan for all of them. It will also be Mr Fitzgerald's first trip to Japan and, while he may be a little concerned about being left standing at the train station, he can be assured that he too will have the time of his life!
