

FARAWAY FILMS

Faraway Films have again delivered their highly successful workshop for students in Years 9-12. Linda Hays, a professional based in Los Angeles ran the workshop. Linda has worked in the film industry and has experience in conducting both professional and school-based workshops. The responses from students were very positive; most said they felt much more confident to approach studying and writing about film in the HSC as a result.

The workshop was in two sections. **The Language of the Script** examines in detail the role and characterisation of hero characters as well as defining the worlds of the film. It then focused on the supporting characters; identifying them, their roles, relationships and functions on the plot and subplots. **The Language of the Screen** taught students how the director's concept is developed from the initial idea to the finished product. Topics included cinematography, sound, production design and the editing process.

We do review class placements at the end of each semester.

FROM PAGE TO STAGE

A group of ex-students from Mudgee High is currently rehearsing the play which was one of their HSC texts. Last year, as Year 12 Extension English students, they studied Crime Writing texts including Tom Stoppard's 'The Real Inspector Hound'. The students' enthusiasm for the play has led to the upcoming Mudgee Performing Arts Society production of the play.

A required component of their study was to imagine how the play could be staged.

'We came up with plenty of ideas and that led us to think about doing our own production', said Alex Faber, one of the performers. 'We didn't have time last year due to the HSC but once the exams were over we began rehearsing.'

'The Real Inspector Hound' is a one act whodunit with a twist. While there are strong echoes of Agatha Christie's 'The Mousetrap' in the play, 'The Real Inspector Hound' is more than a traditional country house weekend mystery. The distinction between reality and fantasy becomes blurred as Stoppard wittily challenges conventions.

The original group has been joined by other students most of whom were in Mudgee High School's powerful production of 'The Crucible' last year.

Directed by Heather Rushton, the performances will take place at Mudgee's Town Hall Theatre on Friday 19th March at 8pm, and Saturday 20th March at 2pm and 8pm. Tickets \$12 with \$8 concession (children and pensioners) will be available at the door.

TRIP TO BINNAWAY

Recently a science team travelled to Binnaway to participate in the joint development of quality teaching resources. Part of this development was to monitor chemical safety and to examine successful teaching methodologies and strategies. Binnaway is a central school located less than half an hour from Coonabarabran and is one of the spoke schools for Mudgee High School as a Centre for Excellence. It has a dedicated staff that is focusing on maximising student achievement through quality teaching.


Mudgee High School has been able to contribute through a day spent developing resources such as effective programs, innovative experiments, quality assessment tasks and high quality classroom teaching practises.

Mr Tollhurst the science teacher from Binnaway paid a return trip to Mudgee High School to examine a variety of high quality teaching practises including both practical and theoretical lessons. Additionally time was spent looking at the variety of ways in which assessment is done such as the OEI, the Open Ended Investigation for both stage 4 and stage 5 science.

Both schools greatly benefit from the exchange of ideas and the development of resources, which ultimately is reflected in improved quality teaching practises in the classroom. A benefit to students in both schools.
