### **Athletics Carnival**

### CHANGE OF DATE FOR THE SCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY

The arrangements for the school cross country have been changed. The details are as follows:

Year 7 and students in Years 9-12 who have previously nominated themselves will compete at Redbank Dam Reserve during periods 7 and 8 this Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> May. Students should change into their PDHPE uniform during lunch and meet on the oval at the end of lunch. Year 7 roll mark will occur in their usual classes and Years 9-12 will be marked as one group. \$2 will be collected for bus travel.

**Year 8** will compete at Redbank Dam Reserve during their Sport periods (1 and 2) this Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> May. Students will attend roll call to have their name marked off. They are then to move to the changerooms to get changed into their PDHPE uniform before meeting on the oval for Sport rolls to be marked. \$2 will be collected for the bus by Sports teachers.

All students are expected to attend and will be required to stay with the group – there is no provision for students to stay at school. Students who are unable to participate due to injury or illness will be given a job assisting with the organisation of the event.

Students who do not wish to run the course may walk it. This event is about promoting physical activity as much as it is about selecting our top performers for the next level. Regular classes will be conducted for the remainder of the day.

### **MATHEMATICS NEWS**

### **Australian Mathematics competition**

This years Australian Mathematics Competition is on the 5<sup>th</sup> August. 47 students from Mudgee High have entered the competition from a range of years and courses. If students are not familiar with the format or types of questions asked they should see their Maths teacher to look at some past competition papers. Good luck to all that have entered.

### **Super Rule**

The HSC is a demanding time for students and it is essential that students are well prepared for lessons with the right equipment. Students who are completing the HSC this year must have an approved scientific calculator. Students are asked to check with their teacher in case their calculator is not approved. Those students sitting the General Mathematics examinations can also take in an approved graphics calculator and we ask that students notify their teacher if they are intending to take such a calculator into the examination. Being unfamiliar with a calculator can severely affect a student's results.

Besides a rule students in the Mathematics and Extension Mathematics courses can purchase a mathematics template which has been approved for use in their examinations. The template is referred to as a Super Rule and can be purchased for \$11.60

### **Calculators**

**All** students in years 7 to 12 need to use calculators in their Mathematics classes. The Mathematics courses are designed to make use of calculator technology to assist students to develop more difficult concepts without becoming bogged down in manual calculations. Mental calculations skills are also practiced as part of the course.

It is important for students to have a calculator of the type approved by the Board of Studies. In the past some students have disadvantaged themselves by not practicing their skills on a calculator that they can use in their final exams. Students are advised to check with your Maths teacher that your calculator is an approved model.


Approved calculators can be purchased from the front office for \$17.00 which is cost price to us. If families have calculators which are no longer needed by ex-students they can be used. It is not necessary to buy the latest model. If students look after their calculator it will last throughout their time at school and beyond.

### Reminder to Year 12


Year 12 are reminded to pay their \$19.00 for past paper HSC booklets as soon as possible. These booklets give you past exams showing all solutions.

### "Navigating Teenage Depression" - presented by The Black Dog Institute

MHS is hosting an information evening for parents on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> May, beginning at 7pm in the school's Performance Centre. This evening will be presented by Dr Tessa Wigney, a staff member of the Black Dog Institute and will focus on the topic of TEENAGE DEPRESSION and MOOD DISORDERS.

This will be an interesting presentation that aims to improve awareness of the symptoms and causes of mood disorders. It includes specific information on how to identify early warning signs of depression and mania in young adults. A particular focus is on understanding the risks of developing a mood disorder within the context of normal teenage pressures such as, performance anxiety, bullying, identity and sexual development etc. Dr Wigney will also present information regarding where to seek help and wellbeing strategies and include tips on how to communicate and reduce stress.

# ThinkUKnow Australia protecting children online

### What is ThinkUKnow?

ThinkUKnow is an internet safety program offering interactive presentations to parents, carers and teachers via primary and secondary schools across Australia, using a network of trained volunteers from the Australian Federal Police (AFP) and Microsoft Australia. Created by the UK Child Exploitation and Online Protection (CEOP) Centre, ThinkUKnow Australia is being rolled out nationally by the AFP and Microsoft Australia.

### Some of the threats for young people online

Cyber-bullying involves the use of information and communication technologies (ICT) to support deliberate, repeated, and hostile behaviour by an

individual or group that is intended to harm others.

This form of bullying is often carried out using mobile phones or the internet.

Online Grooming is the deliberate actions taken by an adult to form a trusting relationship with a child with the intent of later facilitating sexual contact. This can take place in chat rooms, instant messaging, social networking sites and email. Once contact has been made, child sex offenders then move towards more traditional means of communication such as over the phone.

Sharing Personal Information. Social networking sites such as Facebook and MySpace have great appeal for young people, but the information which is shared on a social networking site can have repercussions. Social networking can also be used as part of the grooming process. The information could also be used to identify the physical location of the young person.
