Regional Bonus Points Scheme

Charles Sturt University (CSU) offers a Regional Bonus Point (RPB) program to school leavers in regional areas throughout Australia. The program offers an additional five points to the university admission score of regional school leavers. CSU recognises that higher education participation rates are quite often lower in regional, non-metropolitan areas. It's important to remember that bonus points are automatically added to the university admission score, students do not need to apply for them. For school leavers the RBP program relates to the school you attend, not the place you live. For non school leavers the program is linked to your home address and postcode. PREP – an early entry program PREP stands for Principal's Report Entry Program and is a great way for academically talented students from high schools in the non-metropolitan areas of NSW, ACT and Victoria get their foot in the door at Charles Sturt University (CSU). To be eligible, a Year 12 student needs to be identified by their school principal as a consistent achiever with the potential to succeed in university studies. CSU offers many courses to undergraduate students however some courses are excluded from PREP, such as Communications courses, Dental Science and Veterinary Science.
