CAREERS NEWS University of Sydney Summer School – Head Start Lectures – For Students Studying Year 12 in 2012

Students will also receive comprehensive notes that include all of the relevant theory (transcribed into student friendly language), fully worked examples, take home questions, as well as advance exposure to exam style questions and analytical/problem solving strategies so as to maximise mid-year examination scores.

NOTE: The Summer School lectures are being prepared and delivered by qualified, currently practising HSC teachers and markers who possess the knowledge and experience to demonstrate the means by which students can achieve the Band 6 scores.

Students who have attended the Summer School programs in past years agree that these programs strengthened understanding of course materials, decreased workloads and stress levels at school, increased confidence and motivation and greatly improved performance in tests, assignments and exams.

FROM THE MINISTER FOR EDUCATION

Commitment to Improving Teacher Quality Boosted for 2012

Mudgee High School Centre for Excellence for One More Year

The NSW Minister for Education Adrian Piccoli announced today an expansion of the Government's commitment to improved teacher quality. Mr Piccoli said the investment will come through the extension of the Smarter Schools National Partnership on Improving Teacher Quality. "We will increase our commitment in an established program and a new one," Mr Piccoli said. "Extra funding support will be offered to NSW government schools already operating as Centres for Excellence, and another group of schools not already receiving National Partnership funding will be invited to participate in the new Teacher Quality Project."

"We are extending the reach of the Smarter Schools program, because nothing is as important in a child's school education as the quality of their teachers."

"NSW public schools have a wealth of teaching expertise and this expansion will enable schools participating in this initiative to better spread the knowledge of best teaching practice."

Thirty five NSW government schools currently operate as Centres for Excellence. One of the initiatives these schools have developed through the program is strengthened links to university teaching faculties which has increased support to teaching students.

The 13 schools that started as Centres of Excellence last year will now be invited to participate in a one-year transition program, with funding support of up to \$200,000 to further embed practices that improve teacher quality. This means that Mudgee High School will continue as a Centre for Excellence in 2012.

SCHOOL UNIFORM CODE

BOYS:

- Grey shorts with the school badge OR grey trousers (track pants or ruggers are NOT permitted).
- A white polo shirt with embroidered badge OR business style shirt.

Senior Option

• Polo shirt may have blue/red stripes on collar. A navy jumper OR deep red jumper with embroidered badge for seniors OR navy blue sloppy joe with the school badge (no hoods).

GIRLS:

- Navy skirt OR navy dress shorts with the school badge OR navy dress pants (track pants or ruggers are NOT permitted).
- A white polo shirt with embroidered badge OR business style shirt.
- Navy blue MHS school jumper or navy blue sloppy joe with the school badge (no hoods).
- Navy weatherproof jacket with the school badge.
- Hats are recommended for protection from the sun and "bucket" hats with the school crest are the most preferable.
- Black or white shoes must be enclosed and comply with Occupational Health and Safety Requirements which require that the upper toe section of the shoe be leather.
- Sport Uniform: all students to wear red polo shirt. Navy blue shorts or navy track pants with MHS embroidery.

Senior Option

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PDHPE and Sports Uniform

• Students are to wear sports uniform for all practical PE lessons – if this is not possible, students should wear clothes similar to the sports uniform and appropriate for a practical lesson and bring an explanatory note from home.

No commercial logos, stripes or other decorations are permitted.

Please make sure all articles of clothing are marked with student's name.

Where students are unable to wear full uniform a note must be brought to roll call and a uniform pass will be issued.
