The Minister for Education has announced consultation regarding a strategy to allow greater decision making at the local level in schools. School Education Director, Peter Harvey has been given the brief of conducting consultation in Western NSW Region, he will be holding a consultation forum for parents at Mudgee High School Library on Monday 14th November from 6pm to 7.30pm. ENGLISH FACULTY NEWS

Two wonderful opportunities for our students coming up this term . . .

On Monday 7th November a group of our Year 9 and Year 11 students will have a script writing workshop with Michaeley O'Brien. Michaeley is a professional script-writer who has worked extensively in television and has created the scripts for episodes of Underbelly Razor and McLeod's Daughters, among others. She has very kindly offered her time and expertise to our students without charge. The workshops involve discussion about the process of script-writing, examination of some script extracts and comparing them with the finished product. There will be plenty of opportunity to ask questions. The timing of this visit coincides with the School Certificate exams preventing some students taking part but it may be possible to invite Michaeley back to the school at a later date.

Beginning on Monday 21st November the school is welcoming two educators from the Bell Shakespeare Company for a two week residency. This is an exciting opportunity for our students who will have the benefit of a series of free workshops with these highly qualified Shakespearean actor/educators. Each year there are only two of these residencies offered to schools so we are very privileged to be chosen.

Students from year 11 Advanced English will have a unique opportunity to explore their HSC Shakespeare text, Hamlet, from a performance perspective. We hope this will provide insight and raise awareness of different interpretations and issues within the texts.

Year 10 students will have opportunity to get a head start for year 11 through some workshops to introduce their year 11 text, Othello. All students who nominated Advanced English for 2012 will be expected to attend but all students are welcome.

Year 9 will all be following up their study of Romeo and Juliet and Year 8 students will have the chance to go to a workshop on Midsummer Night's Dream. The focus of both of these sets of workshops is on enjoying the texts, learning to read them and make sense of them. The Bell performers are very entertaining and we think that our students will all have a wonderful time.

<u>English Faculty News continuted</u>: Students in Drama will also benefit from a series of acting workshops and performance skills. All students undertaking a Drama module in VI as well as the HSC group can expect to be involved. We urge our students to take the opportunity to take part in these learning experiences that don't come along every day

BEEF BONANZA STEER SHOW



Eleven Mudgee High students recently attended the annual steer show in Scone, known as the Beef Bonanza, and came home with their best results ever. This caps an excellent year of steer showing with top awards going to steers in Dubbo during March.

The three steers we transported to Scone took out a first in class and two Highly Commended ribbons. The results got better with carcase results placing us 1st and 2nd in classes and champion lightweight carcase. Students and staff did an exceptional job preparing the steers for parading and finishing them for sale. Over the 3 days of camping, they worked hard, supporting each other and the assisted staff throughout.

Congratulations are also due to Kaylee Harradine who was a finalist in the 16-17 Years parading competition. This is a hotly contested event and attests to the talent she possesses for showing the steer and presenting herself for the judge. The 6 other students who paraded performed admirably under difficult conditions, with torrential rain and delays due to storms.
