Principal's Message

Welcome to all students and parents to Term 1 2011. The year started with some wonderful accolades for Mudgee High School students and ex-students. The first week has been a challenge for both studnts and staff with the very hot conditions. SCIENCE NEWS

Firstly I would like to welcome all students back to 2011 and I hope that the Christmas break was enjoyed by all. This year also brings some new staff members to the Science faculty at Mudgee High School. I would like to welcome Ms Monica Howard (permanent appointment) and Mr Neil Manwaring (temporary appointment for 2011).

- Ms Howard joins us from Newcastle University where she recently completed her Science and Teaching qualifications. Monica brings expertise in plant physiology and has been heavily involved in coordinating interactive science demonstrations throughout Australia.
- Although Mr Manwaring spent a few weeks with us last year after finishing his teaching qualifications, we are
 happy to see him return in a more substantial science teaching capacity this year. Mr Manwaring has a PhD in
 Genetics and joins teaching after working as a research geneticist in Royal North Shore Hospital. His expertise
 in this area will be of great benefit to students and science staff alike. We wish these two new members of staff
 the best of luck this year.

Being so early in the school year there is not very much news to report, however it is a good opportunity to draw your attention to a few aspects of Science

- 1. **Practical Footwear** It is an OH&S requirement that ALL students conducting practical work in a laboratory have fully enclosed non-porous shoes. This means that open footwear like sandals, dance style shoes etc are not appropriate. This also includes canvas gym shoes that will readily absorb liquids. We would greatly appreciate your assistance in keeping your student safe in the laboratory.
- 2. **Long Hair** If your student has long hair it is essential that they bring with them an elastic to tie it back during practical work.
- 3. **Science Books** most students have already presented to class fully prepared and are to be congratulated. However, I would like to request that if your student's book has not been covered with a protective layer, such as contact, it should be done as soon as possible. This will assist in maintaining the student's book in a suitable manner for the duration of the year. More information on books required for each course will be given to students in class.

Student Opportunities

This year will see ALL students have the opportunity to engage in experiences designed to enhance the science curriculum. These may range from excursions to competitions and visiting exhibitions. I would like to request that you encourage your student to participate in as many of these as they can. This will help assist the students engagement in this subject area and also provide an opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of science.

SPORT

Very soon a number of the CHS competitions will begin and many students will be trialling for representative sporting teams. If a student is selected, they will be required to attend training and compete at various times. If your child is representing the school in a team please ensure you and your child are aware of who the coach is, the team training times and competition dates, this will ensure that sporting excursions are well organised and that students gain maximum enjoyment and benefit from participating.

AG NEWS

Christmas came early for the Ag staff when the school purchased a self feeder for the show cattle. This allowed staff some respite from feeding over the Christmas period and the savings in feed from reduced wastage has made this a cost-effective investment. We wish to thank Mudgee Rural Supplies and Arrow Farm Quip for a generous

discount and accelerated delivery on this purchase.

Also in the holidays we acquired an identity at Cox Street. A sign recognising the farm was erected near the main gate. The farm fences are beginning to take shape again after washing out in last year's flood. Our farm assistant, Sam Loveday has worked hard over the vacation to replace a substantial portion.

Looking ahead, we have plans to enter sheep and cattle in the Mudgee Show. Students will begin preparing our stud White Suffolk sheep and led steers this week. Some Primary Industries students will undertake the preparation and showing as part of their compulsory Work Placement. The three Angus steers, which were donated by Coffin Creek stud, have been given intensive work over the vacation to prepare them for student handling. They have responded well and are looking good. This year we will exhibit at the Royal Easter Show and a team of 6 students are being sought to assist.

Our annual 'End of Summer" plant and poultry sale is tentatively scheduled for Saturday March 12. Details will follow later but you are asked to diary this date. At present there is expected to be more than 200 individual poultry from day old to point of lay. We have young Isa Brown layers for the first time with our regular pure breed animals. Also a range of new plant varieties. Proceeds from sales go directly to the Ag Plot to fund capital improvements and consumables.

Year 12 Primary Industries students will begin picking corn this week to complete one of the competencies begun last year. It is an interesting observation to compare the slightly stunted early crop, which went under water in the flood, to the vigorous later sown crop. Pumpkins have suffered significantly as a result of flooding. It is very clear to see the effect on farm income from recent widespread flooding following even minor inundation. Our poultry have been very productive over summer and, for a short time, there are day-old chicks available in several breeds. Contact the Ag staff for details.

Clean used plastic supermarket bags are always in demand at the farm. If you have any at home, they can be delivered to the office or the staff rooms for Science or Agriculture.

ANGLICARE - Western NSW - No Interest Loan Scheme

A NILS loan is an alternate form of credit, not emergency relief, with no fees or charges. The aim is to provide low income earners the means to purchase essential household items. Loans are provided to people who have the ability to repay the loan in small fortnightly repayments. You are eligible to access a loan from us if you live in the Mid Western Regional Council area and are on a Centrelink benefit or are a low income earner. The money can be used to purchase things like electrical goods, furniture, baby items, medical equipment, mobility aids or something else that will improve the quality of life for you. It cannot be used for living expenses, rent and bond money or debt repayment. The maximum amount of the loan is \$1200 for 18 months. If you are interested please phone 1800 644 556 (Anglicare Western, Dubbo) to check your eligibility and receive the information pack. If you wish to proceed with your application it will then be dealt with locally.
