Principal's Message

On Monday 28 March at 7.30 p.m. our annual general meeting for the Mudgee High School P&C will be held. All parents are welcome to attend but only current members will have voting rights. Parents can join on the night and will be able to stand for positions that are left vacant after the meeting.

Prior to the P&C meeting at 7.00 p.m. we will be holding a tour of our new trade training centre. All parents are invited to attend the tour even if they cannot stay on for the P&C meeting. For the tour we will meet near the school gymnasium. At the conclusion of the tour we will proceed to the library for the AGM.

<u>Uniform</u>

Over the past term we have been working on implementing our new uniform policy. My thanks to the families who have supported the changes and purchased logos and new uniforms. At our last P&C meeting a decision was made to give all parents more time to meet the new requirements as some have struggled to change over by the end of this term.

To assist all parents organise for students to be wearing shorts with school logos we have extended the deadline to the start of term 4 2011. From the beginning of term 2 students are not permitted to wear ruggers for everyday wear or for sport. All students must be wearing the styles of shorts approved by the P&C but do not have to have the logo until term 4. We hope this eases the pressure on families.

A reminder, however that if students need warmer items in the coming months, they must wear school trousers or slacks not track pants for everyday wear and only school jumpers or jackets. This requirement has not changed. Anyone experiencing difficulty meeting uniform requirements can make a confidential request for student assistance by obtaining a form from the office.

ILLNESS AND MOBILE PHONES

In recent days we have had a number of students who, feeling ill, have made contact with home via mobile phone. This is often followed by the appearance of a parent or carer at the office, asking to see the sick child. A fair request, except no one other than the child and the carer know anything about the illness. In extreme cases following one of these distress-texts, some students have gone home with their parents/carers *without* notifying the school.

Schools everywhere have a duty of care to their students. Mudgee High is no different. The school is accountable for the well-being of everyone who attends and this accountability extends to illness and attendance. The vast majority of students will, if ill, let a teacher know. All staff are trained in First Aid. Depending on the nature of the illness, a student may be asked to take some time out in the sick bay where they will be monitored, or a parent may be contacted or, in more serious cases, an ambulance will be called. So please encourage your children to tell a teacher first.

YEAR 7 CLASS CHANGES

In Second Term, there will be some class changes in Year 7. As you may already be aware, there are at present two 'A' stream classes and six 'B' stream classes. From Thursday 28 April (the first day of the new term for all students) there will be two 'A' stream classes and **five** 'B' stream classes. This situation has come about because enrolments in Year 7 did not match the numbers predicted at the end of 2010.

Six students have been promoted from various 'B' stream classes into the A' stream, based on demonstrated academic performance across the range of their subjects.

7 Oakey will be disbanded. Those students currently in 7 Oakey who have not been promoted to 'A' stream will be accommodated in the remaining five 'B' stream classes, other than 7 Turon.

7 Turon will remain unchanged.

The changed class lists will be posted on the windows of the clinic, facing the main quad *before* the end of Term 1 to allow students the opportunity to familiarise themselves with the new arrangements.

PARTNERSHIP FORGES SUCCESS

A partnership between a local Angus Stud and Mudgee High School has resulted in double victories in the recent Dubbo Beef Spectacular.

Owner of Coffin Creek Angus, Nigel White, approached Mudgee High School principal, Louise Manwaring late in 2010 to prepare 3 steers for the Sydney Royal. Students and staff took up the challenge with vigour and the animals were looking destined for great things when they first went on display at the Mudgee Show.



It was a crushing blow when an injury to 2 animals in transit forced their withdrawal from Sydney and a shadow fell over all concerned. "Fortunately the organisers of Dubbo's Beef Spectacular allowed a late entry into their 'Pen of 3 Steers' competition and the rest is history" said Mrs Manwaring. "While the students were not able to display their efforts in a led steer competition and felt extreme disappointment when told they could not compete in Sydney, this is the best possible outcome under the circumstances".

The steers took out champion pen of 3 in both the live and carcase competitions in a very competitive field. They showed good muscling and growth and finished uniformly with a comfortable margin to second place in the carcase section. On the hoof, the steers were like 'peas in a pod' and stood out from the rest for their finish and evenness.

Mudgee High had the animals for just over 100 days and throughout, the steers were fed a mixture of Rumevite pellets and barley with ad lib hay. Gratitude is extended to Mudgee CRT and Rumevite for another partnership that provided the pelleted ration at a discount rate.

Discussions are already underway for the students to again take up the challenge in 2012. "This is a partnership we are keen to continue" concluded Mrs Manwaring.

9/10 TOUCH - ORANGE ALL SCHOOLS

On Thursday 17th March the boys and girls 9/10 Mudgee High touch team embarked on another adventure to the All Schools carnival held in Orange.
