#### **INDUSTRIAL ARTS**

HSC major projects in Design and Technology and Industrial Technology are now well underway and students are working towards completion in August this year. This is always a busy time as many students are doing more than one major work and careful time management is becoming essential.

The end of term means that students have selected new Vertical Integration elective subjects. Students are reminded that if they have selected an Industrial Technology timber or metal elective that the wearing of enclosed solid leather or leather like footwear is compulsory under OHS legislation. This is not only a department requirement but a workcover requirement as well. Students in years 9 and 10 are expected to bring their DER laptop fully charged to each lesson at the beginning of the course to allow for the completion of mandatory safety tests. This must be done before commencing any practical. Again this is a compulsory requirement of these courses. This enables students to be well prepared to follow all practical room safety rules.

Many students in Industrial Technology Timber have been exposed to the world of CNC routing and machining this semester. Mr Smith, Mr Huish and Mr O'Sullivan have been working hard and students are reaping the benefits with engraved names and logos appearing on many projects upon their completion. This is a great technology, one which students are really enjoying.
