THE LATEST FROM MATHS

HSC Holiday workshops - During the July school holidays a number of students from Extension Mathematics, Mathematics and General Mathematics attended workshops targeting designated areas of study in order to strengthen student skills.

Extension Mathematics and Mathematics students were able to catch up on work from term 2 and also to practise exam skills for the upcoming trials and HSC exams.

General Mathematics students were given the opportunity to review Preliminary course work, develop their algebraic modelling skills (graphing) and practise their Spherical Geometry.

HSC workshops Term 3 - Students studying Mathematics courses will be offered a one hour work session every Monday afternoon during Term 3 from 3.30pm to 4.30 pm. The session has been created in order to strengthen their skills in the lead up to the HSC. It also provides students with assistance with more difficult work. It is hoped that students from all courses will take advantage of this extra time provided by the Mathematics staff.

Future HSC Holiday Workshops - During the September/October school holidays workshops will again be run for each Mathematics course. Students are encouraged to keep an ear out for when these sessions will be run. This is a great opportunity to further strengthen skills in the build up to the final exam and again it is hoped that students from all courses will take advantage of the extra assistance provided.

Australian Mathematics Competition - Mudgee High School once again has a strong contingent of students entered for this prestigious competition. Held on Thursday August 4th, this competition gives students the opportunity to challenge themselves with some higher order thinking and logic skills.

This year we have a number of students over three different levels who have accepted the challenge. Students are reminded to pick up an information sheet from Mr. Lynn in the Mathematics staffroom well before the day of the competition. This sheet gives details regarding equipment needed for the day of the competition and some general ideas about the nature of the content. Any student who wishes to test themselves with a similar past competition paper should see Mr. Lynn beforehand.

The Mathematics department of Mudgee High School is proud of those who have accepted the challenge and wish them well.

Super Rule - The HSC is a demanding time and it is essential that students are well prepared for lessons with the right equipment. Students who are completing the HSC this year must have an approved scientific calculator. Students are asked to check with their teacher in case their calculator is not approved. Those students sitting the General Mathematics examinations can also take in an approved graphics calculator and we ask that students notify their teacher if they are intending to take such a calculator into the examination. Being unfamiliar with a calculator can severely affect a student's results.

Besides a rule students in the Mathematics and Extension Mathematics courses can purchase a mathematics template which has been approved for use in their examinations. The template is referred to as a Super Rule and can be purchased for \$11.60

Calculators - All students in years 7 to 12 need to use calculators in their Mathematics classes. The Mathematics courses are designed to make use of calculator technology to assist students to develop more difficult concepts without becoming bogged down in manual calculations. Mental calculations skills are also practiced as part of the course.

It is important for students to have a calculator of the type approved by the Board of Studies. In the past some students have disadvantaged themselves by not practicing their skills on a calculator that they can use in their final exams. Students are advised to check with your Maths teacher that your calculator is an approved model.

Approved calculators can be purchased from the front office for \$17.00 which is cost price to us. If families have calculators which are no longer needed by ex-students they can be used. It is not necessary to buy the latest model. If students look after their calculator it will last throughout their time at school and beyond.

Teachers too, have the chance to work collaboratively in the classroom and, more importantly, to plan for future learning.

Of course, after hours students were eager to chat among their rarely-seen classmates about life in their home towns and base schools, too. The *xsel* cup, a hotly contested but friendly competition involving sport and parlour games, was also held after hours and was won narrowly by the student side. Surprisingly, the limerick writing competition was the deciding factor!

By Thursday afternoon students were happy to begin their homeward journeys feeling that being both rewarding and challenging, an xsel residential is a fitting end to the 2011 academic semester.
