NAPLAN results for students in Years 7 and 9 were handed out last week. Any parent who wishes to discuss their student's results is welcome to contact Mrs Gooley to make an appointment. In general our results show high levels of skill in reading, spelling and grammar and the range of numeracy areas. Students were challenged by the change to the persuasive writing task right across the State and this is an area where we will continue to focus in 2012.

Our percentages of students in the higher bands 9 and 10 were better than the numbers across our region and in similar schools. Particularly in the areas of reading and numeracy many of our students are achieving at the highest levels. The proportion of students who struggle with literacy has fallen since the last NAPLAN results and there has been substantial growth for almost all students from tests taken two years ago.

All Year 7 and 9 students can be proud of their efforts. Parents can be confident we at Mudgee High School will use the results to guide our planning for 2012 in these areas.

AGRICULTURE NEWS

As we move into spring, things are heating up at the School Farm also. In the school nursery, plants are putting out new growth and we are preparing for our BIG Spring Sale on October 15. More details will be published later but diary the date now. We will also have an extensive range of poultry with more hybrid laying hens than previous sales.

Our White Suffolk Stud ewes have lambed and it has been a very productive year to date. Students see this as part of the productive cycle and have been involved in the husbandry of sheep on the farm. We will have one flock ram for sale on October 15.

Our show cattle are looking superb and are responding to the training. Students have been involved in the whole process of taking unbroken steers from the paddock and transforming them into quiet, responsive show animals. They should now appreciate that it is time consuming and requires a degree of patience and some understanding of animal behaviour. Students will present their steers in Scone at the end of October. The preparation of Angus steers from our sponsoring stud, Coffin Creek, is expected to begin mid-October. If plans go as expected, these will parade at the Sydney Royal.

Year 8 Technology Mandatory students are seeing growth in their gardens and should be harvesting early vegetables shortly. This compulsory subject is a 'taster' for elective Agriculture, with an introduction to plants and the care of poultry and rabbits.

As this goes to print, Year 10 students will be making their subject choices for 2012. It is worth noting that Australia is not producing enough Agriculture graduates to meet industry needs and can be a richly rewarding vocation. For those who don't aspire to university, *Primary Industries* provides a sound practical background that can be used in employment and develops many skills that can also be used on small family farms and around the home.
