If you don't get one please contact the office. You can also make appointments by phoning the teacher. This is a chance to meet your student's new teachers and discuss issues which may help him/her make good progress this year. Parents of Year 9 also have a meeting on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> February at 6.30pm. This meeting will discuss the issuing of laptops to Year 9 students. It is essential all Year 9 students and a parent attend this meeting in the Performance Centre.

As happens every year our timetable will need some adjustments in the first few weeks. Some small classes may be amalgamated while other overly large classes will need to be split into two groups. This enables us to make best use of available resources to meet student needs. We are working toward this as quickly as possible to minimise disruption. More information will be given to students and parents as the process evolves. The major changes will be in Year 10 where numbers are smaller than last year, and Year 11 where numbers are larger than anticipated.

## **ATTENTION YEAR 7 STUDENTS**

Just a reminder that all students in Year 7 must have a Scientific Calculator for Maths. ## CAREERS CAPERS!

During 2012 a number of careers related opportunities will be available to students to assist with their post school transition. The Careers Room (B18) also has resources available which students and parents are welcome to peruse and borrow.

Year 10 students will have Career Education for one period/week for the year dealing with such issues as career planning, preparing for work and post school options. Year 10 students will also be expected to complete a minimum of one week of work experience during the year.

All the students in Years 10-12 have the opportunity to participate in work experience which continues to be an effective way for students to evaluate career choices, establish workplace 'contacts' and develop skills.

Parents/Carers are encouraged to be involved in their child's career decision making by attending career information sessions, guest speakers etc at the school. Career events are usually advertised to students and parents via daily announcements in Roll Call, the DEC email and school newsletter.

Some upcoming career events for 2012 include:

**Regional University Roadshow** – Representatives from Charles Sturt, Southern Cross and the University of New England will speak with Year 12 students (and parents) on Tuesday 14.2.12 at 9.20am in the school gymnasium. Topics for discussion will include university courses, costs, pathways to uni, uni life and more.

**Charles Sturt University (CSU) 'My Day' –** Charles Sturt University (Bathurst, Dubbo, Wagga and Albury campuses) will offer Years 11 and 12 students a series of one day 'showcase' events featuring particular university courses eg Exercise Science and Arts / Business at Bathurst on 24<sup>th</sup> February and 16<sup>th</sup> March respectively.
