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# **Principal's Message**

Many thanks to our parents who participated in the student laptop information evening and parent teacher afternoon. We appreciate the extra time you all took to support your children on these important occassions.

During last week I attended the Western NSW Regional Principal's conference. Michele Bruniges the Director General of the Department of Education gave a brief overview of the recent government announcement about local decision making in schools. The proposals are far reaching and will have an impact on the way schools are administered within the next five years.

Principals and other staff will be working to ensure that any changes have as their main focus, students and their learning. Changing how bills are paid, providing for more say in managing resources and staff are the major elements of the proposals. There are however, no additional resources as yet announced.

We here in Mudgee are priviledged to have very accomplished and dedicated staff and a supportive community. This is why we have such exceptional student results. Finances and resources underpin effective learning but it is the quality of the teaching that makes the most difference. That is why at Mudgee High School we focus on the concept of shared learning. Students, teachers and parents all have to be learning so that we have continued improvement. Parents do this at home with students and by being involved in school initiatives such as parent teacher meetings. Teachers do this by engaging in opportunities for professional learning with other experts including their colleages.

On March 26 our P&C AGM will be another important chance for parents to be involved. All welcome.

Some schools across the state will pilot the new processes. These 229 schools have elected to focus on implementing the changes immediately. At Mudgee High School we will take every opportunity to have input to final decisions without making their implementation our major focus. 

#### MATHEMATICS NEWS Australian Mathematics Competition

On the 2nd of August this year Mudgee High School students will once again be invited to attempt the Australian Mathematics Competition. This is a test of mathematical, logical and problem solving skills involving 30 multiple choice questions. All students are encouraged to enter this competition, especially those with talent in the subject or who enjoy a challenge. All entrants receive a certificate of participation, with higher credentials for different levels of success also on offer (great certificates for resumes and CV's). Exceptionally talented students may also be in line for some of the many cash prizes available.

Although the competition is on later in the year our school entry needs to be in early next term.

To enter this competition, students will need to pay \$5 to the front office by the end of term (Thursday 5th April). More information and sample papers can be obtained from any mathematics teacher at MHS or Mr Lynn.

#### World of Maths

Year 7 & 8 students at Mudgee High School have been given the opportunity to attend an exciting Mathematics presentation from the people at World of Maths. This opportunity will be offered to 60 students from Year 7 & 8. A small cost of \$6 per student will be incurred. Please keep your eyes open for notes coming home.

#### Super Rule

The HSC is a demanding time for students and it is essential that students are well prepared for lessons with the right equipment. Students who are completing the HSC this year must have an approved scientific calculator. Students are asked to check with their teacher in case their calculator is not approved. Those students sitting the General Mathematics examinations can also take in an approved graphics calculator and we ask that students notify their teacher if they are intending to take such a calculator into the examination. Being unfamiliar with a calculator can severely affect a student result. Besides a rule students in the Mathematics and Extension Mathematics courses can purchase a mathematics template which has been approved for use in their examinations. The template is referred to as a Super Rule and can be purchased for \$8.00

# Calculators

All students in years 7 to 12 need to use calculators in their Mathematics classes. The Mathematics courses are designed to make use of calculator technology to assist students to develop more difficult concepts without becoming bodged down in manual calculations. Mental calculations skills are also practiced as part of the course. It is important for students to have a calculator of the type approved by the Board of Studies. In the past some students have disadvantaged themselves by not practising their skills on a calculator that they can use in their final exams. Students are advised to check with your Maths teacher that your calculator is an approved model. Approved calculators can be purchased from the front office for \$17.00 which is cost price to us. If families have calculators which are no longer needed by ex-students they can be used. It is not necessary to buy the latest model. If students look after their calculator it will last throughout their time at school and beyond.

#### Year 9 Laptops in Mathematics

By now most Year 9 students should have received their DER laptops for use at MHS. In Mathematics the laptops will be used in a variety of different ways. Initially, and ongoing, the laptops can be used to access an electronic version of each of the text books used in the Year 9 courses. These textbooks can be downloaded from the school server (Subject Share folder). Students need to communicate with their maths teachers regarding access and use of this text. In the future, the laptops will be used extensively in some topics and sparingly in others. As with expectations across the school, all students should bring their laptops to all lessons and rely on teacher instructions regarding their possible use.

#### AG UPDATE

The Mudgee Agriculture faculty has been busy this term with more on the horizon.

Technology Mandatory have tidied up their gardens and begun to get their seeds and seedlings into the ground. In a few weeks, it should be a treat to the eve for anyone passing the Denison Street farm. The poultry have been growing in number at this farm also and, with the occasional horse or goat, provide some entertainment for passers-by. After prolonged trouble with the incubator, we hope the problems are behind us and we are hatching for our next sale.

On that note, the next plant and poultry sale is scheduled for early next term. Look out for advertisements closer to the date. However, we have 4 rams for immediate sale. All are accredited Brucellosis free. One is 4 tooth and a proven sire. Three are 12 months and show a willingness to work. For more information, contact the Ag teachers.

Meanwhile, at the Cox Street farm, it was a busy time leading up to the Mudgee Show as students prepared the sheep and steers for showing. It was a disappointment that the rain kept us at home on Show day but the experiences learned by students were not diminished.

The show was not without some successes though. Junior Judging continued under cover on the Friday and our students distinguished themselves again. Glenn Bridge was our most outstanding success, placing second in the Zone Final of the grain judging and winning a place to the Royal for the State finals. Other ribbon winners in the Zone Final division were: Rachel Cooksley (3<sup>rd</sup> meat sheep), Gabrielle Saliba (3<sup>rd</sup> wool), Brooke Colley (3<sup>rd</sup>



merino), Nicole Burns (3rd grain). Amongst the Juniors, we have Zachary Kelly (1<sup>st</sup>) and Samantha Perring (3<sup>rd</sup>) in meat sheep, Kelly Parkinson (1<sup>'st</sup>), Swastika Nandini (2<sup>nd</sup>) and Monique Cremona (3<sup>rd</sup>) in wool. The merino placings were Bradley Golden (1<sup>st</sup>), Maxine Pocock (2<sup>nd</sup>) and Jamie Golden (3<sup>rd</sup>) while grain was Brooke Sewell (1<sup>st</sup>), Luke Michie (2<sup>rd</sup>) and Katelyn Kurtz (3<sup>rd</sup>). to these students and to all who participated enthusiastically. The emphasis on the day was learning and, for those who engaged in the activities, it was a great day.

Our steers are looking good for the Royal. Students in many classes have been involved in the washing, grooming, and training of the three Coffin Creek Angus and 10 students will accompany them to Sydney. We have high hopes for at least a little success and the experience of parading in such a prestigious venue will be a highlight for the students. Also at the Royal will be nearly 50 students on our annual pilgrimage to the city. We hope that at least a few will see the steers being auctioned at the end of the competition.

# **MOCK TRIAL COMPETITION 2012**





On Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> March, Mudgee High travelled to Coonabarabran to compete against Coonabarabran High School in the first round of the NSW Law Society Mock Trial Competition. The team was made up of Kate Millar as the first barrister, Lucy O'Connell as the second barrister, Henry Van Laeren as the Solicitor with Frances Johns as his assistant solicitor. Libby Lawson and Lucy Cheetham were the witnesses for the defence. Maddy Fletcher played the role of Court Officer. Through excellent team work and cross questioning of the prosecution witnesses, Mudgee High was able to cast adequate doubt over the prosecution's evidence resulting in the Magistrate dismissing the charges against the defendant. Not only did Mudgee High School win the case, we also won the point score for the competition round. Mudgee High scored 273 points to Coonabarabran High's 254 points. Congratulations to the Mock Trial team for this excellent start to the competition.

# WASTE MANAGEMENT FIELDTRIP 2012

On Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2012, the entire Year 10 group embarked on a fieldtrip to further their studies and understanding of the Geography topic "Waste Management."

The students were divided into three groups which then rotated through the three site studies throughout the day. The sites were as follows:

Mudgee Sewage Treatment Plant This allowed for the students to see the process involved in the treatment of waste water. They learnt that the majority of the waste water which comes through the plant is actually stormwater, including drainage from gutters, houses and runoff. The students witnessed the extensive procedures followed to eliminate toxins from the waste water before it is eventually released back into the river system and continues its journey towards the sea. Recycling Centre and Landfill Site Students were given a guided tour through the recycling plant. Here they saw how the products are divided into paper and cardboard, plastics, glass, steel and aluminium. Students were told of the annual quantities of each recyclable product

and discovered that these figures have greatly increased over the past couple of years due to Mudgee's rapidly growing population. Students also learnt about where the products are transported to after they are sorted here in Mudgee.



Landfill Site Here students had an opportunity to climb to the top of the landfill mound and walk around on the top of it. With almost 30 years of landfill under their feet they were able to view the site of the new landfill area which will begin operation later this year. Students could also see from this vantage point the vegetation waste heap where lopped trees and garden waste is dumped.

Putta Bucca Wetlands Water testing along the river, just below the sewage treatment plant's release point, provided students with an excellent opportunity to learn about the importance of waste management systems being effective. Students conducted a range of water tests, including turbidity, temperature, salinity, pH and they also tested for the presence of macro-invertebrates, which could then provide an indication of the quality of the overall living space for various species of animals.

This fieldtrip provided students with an opportunity to enhance their learning and knowledge about the topic on Waste Management which they are studying as part of their mandatory Geography studies. Year 10 were excellent ambassadors for their school and can be congratulated for their behaviour and positive involvement in the day.

# WESTERN REGION CHS SWIMMING SELECTION TRIALS



After a couple of false starts due to too much water, our swim team finally made it to Cowra for the Western selection trials. 16 students represented Mudgee High School and all of them were successful at gaining selection to represent Mudgee High and Western at NSW CHS Swimming Championships to be held at Homebush 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> April. Almost all students achieved personal best times in 1 or more events on the day. Swimmers represented Mudgee High in 65 of the 92 events held at Cowra. Our 8 relay teams gained 5 first places and 3 second places.
