Debating and Public Speaking

Congratulations to students in our debating and public speaking teams. Both the senior and junior debating teams have made the finals of the Gulgong Eisteddfod. Students will be heading to the Prince of Wales Opera House on 24th May for that competition. Our juniors will argue that "Manners and respect are still important" in their debate with St Matthew's while later in the day the senior team will argue that "Our future does not depend on science" when they face the Dunedoo team. We wish both teams luck in this final phase of the competition.

The Premier's Debating Challenge has just begun. On Tuesday the Yr 7 & 8 team had a win against Kandos High School debating the topic "That learning of a second language should be compulsory in schools". The year 9 & 10 team's first debate was on Thursday against Canobolas High School. We have been fortunate to start the competition with home debates which allow our students the confidence boost of a familiar audience. It is terrific too for our students to be the audience for debates. This provides opportunity to enjoy the speaking and the argument, as well as hearing the elements of persuasive argument.

Kate Millar from Year 11 will represent the school in the Premier's Challenge Public speaking competition held in Bathurst. Coming up soon (May 22nd) is the Lithgow Festival of Speech. We have entered 3 debating teams and 4 public speakers. This is a highly regarded competition and it is always a great day of learning for our students.

To enter all of these competitions takes commitment to learning and excellence from the students, but also from the teachers who give up hours of their time to organise, prepare and travel with these teams to competitions. The school would like to thank Mrs Daniels, Miss Eslick and Mr Cox for their efforts.

Excursions

On Friday next week Year 12 Advanced students will travel to Sydney to see *Hamlet* as part of their HSC preparation. These students have already had the advantage of the Bell Shakespeare workshops but being able to see a live production of the whole play will be a boost for their HSC preparation..

Over a hundred students have expressed interest in the proposed excursion to the Sydney Jewish Museum. This excursion is open to students in Years 9 and 10 who have studied texts and topics linked to the Holocaust and to prejudice and social justice. More details will be sent home in coming weeks. At this stage there will be one bus – about 50 places. The date will most likely be 15th June. Permission notes will be issued to the students who brought back their expression of interest and the places will be filled on a first in basis. If there is a lot of demand we will have a waiting list and will look at the possibility of a second bus.

NAPLAN is next week! Students who have done their work in class and completed their assignments should feel confident about their preparation.

State All Schools Swimming Championships

Macy Morley performed extremely well at the recent All Schools Championships held at Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre last Monday 7th May. Reports back from the pool on the day indicated Macy was quite nervous for her first swim,

the 12yrs 50 Freestyle. Macy overcame her nerves to place 3rd in a time of 30.54 and receive the first of her medal haul. Next was the 12yrs 50 Fly where she missed first place by only .01 of a second, finishing in a time of 32.38 and receiving the silver medal. Her next race was the 12yrs 100 Freestyle where Macy placed 5th. Macy completed the day with a gold medal in the 12yrs 50 Backstroke. Macy now has a complete set of State All Schools medals. Congratulations to Macy and also Mick O'Sullivan her coach on these outstanding results. We look forward to seeing more from Macy next season.
