# **Principal's Message**

**Year 11 2013**: Term 3 has started at a great pace. Last week we met with parents of students in Year 10 to discuss the subject selection process for their transition to Year 11 in 2013. ## MATHEMATICS NEWS



#### HSC Holiday Workshops

During the July school holidays a number of students from Extension Mathematics attended workshops targeting designated areas of study in order to strengthen student skills.

Students were able to catch up on work from term 2 and also to practise exam skills for the upcoming trials and HSC exams.

### HSC workshops Term 3

Students studying Mathematics courses will be offered a one hour work session every Monday afternoon during Term 3 from 3.30pm to 4.30 pm. The session has been created in order to strengthen their skills in the lead up to the HSC. It also provides students with assistance with more difficult work. It is hoped that students from all courses will take advantage of this extra time provided by the Mathematics staff.

Also, students who are struggling with homework or generally needing help with a particular problem are invited to come and get some assistance. On Monday, Wednesday and Friday, at lunch in B09, a Mathematics teacher will be available to help.

#### **Future HSC Holiday Workshops**

During the September/October school holidays workshops will again be run for each Mathematics course. Students are encouraged to keep an ear out for when these sessions will be run. This is a great opportunity to further strengthen skills in the build up to the final exam and again it is hoped that students from all courses will take advantage of the extra assistance provided.

#### **Australian Mathematics Competition**

Mudgee High School once again has a strong contingent of students entered for this prestigious competition. Held this year on Thursday August 2<sup>nd</sup>, this competition gives students the opportunity to challenge themselves with some higher order thinking and logic skills.

This year we have a number of students over three different levels who have accepted the challenge. Students are reminded to pick up an information sheet from Mr. Lynn in the Mathematics staffroom well before the day of the competition. This sheet gives detail regarding equipment needed for the day of the competition and some general ideas about the nature of the content. Any student who wishes to test themselves with a similar past competition paper should see Mr. Lynn beforehand.

The Mathematics department of Mudgee High School is proud of those who have accepted the challenge and wish them well.

## Super Rule

The HSC is a demanding time for students and it is essential that students are well prepared for lessons with the right equipment. Students who are completing the HSC this year must have an approved scientific calculator. Students are asked to check with their teacher in case their calculator is not approved. Those students sitting the General Mathematics examinations can also take in an approved graphics calculator and we ask that students notify their teacher if they are intending to take such a calculator into the examination. Being unfamiliar with a calculator can severely affect a student's results.

Besides a rule students in the Mathematics and Extension Mathematics courses can purchase a mathematics template which has been approved for use in their examinations. The template is referred to as a Super Rule and can be purchased for \$11.60

## Calculators

**All** students in years 7 to 12 need to use calculators in their Mathematics classes. The Mathematics courses are designed to make use of calculator technology to assist students to develop more difficult concepts without becoming bogged down in manual calculations. Mental calculations skills are also practiced as part of the course.

It is important for students to have a calculator of the type approved by the Board of Studies. In the past some students have disadvantaged themselves by not practicing their skills on a calculator that they can use in their final exams. Students are advised to check with your Maths teacher that your calculator is an approved model.

Approved calculators can be purchased from the front office for \$17.00 which is cost price to us. If families have calculators which are no longer needed by ex-students they can be used. It is not necessary to buy the latest model. If students look after their calculator it will last throughout their time at school and beyond.

## **NSW RURAL FIRE SERVICE**

Aider Program – Assistance for Infirm, Disabled and Elderly Residents

Aider is a once off **free** service supporting residents to live safely and confidently in areas where bush fires may start. The property must be bush fire prone, meaning an area of land that can support a bush fire or is likely to be subject to bush fire attack.

Aged residents and residents with disabling conditions who have limited domestic support from family, relatives, friends or other services are eligible to access Aider.

Aider services include: thinning vegetation, removing leaves, sticks and fallen branches, trimming branches from around and overhanging the home, mowing or slashing long grass, cleaning gutters.
