#### **CAREER CAPERS!**

Although Year 12 are busily preparing for their upcoming Trial Exams, they should also be giving some thought to post school destinations. A number of apprentice and traineeship opportunities are available locally for 2013, details of which are being advertised in the local paper, via the internet or through the school. Information sessions relating to these vacancies are also underway.

Students considering TAFE courses in 2013, either locally, face to face or online are advised to research relevant courses and locations. Applications for high demand TAFE courses for 2013 close at the end of October 2012. Students have also been issued their free copy of the 2013 UAC (University Admissions) Guide. This provides information on courses, costs, accommodation, scholarships and more. The closing date for online, on-time university course applications is Friday September 28. Students can nominate up to nine course preferences. All eligible students should apply for university to keep options open. If needs be, deferment of a course offer in January 2013 is always a possibility.

Students should also consider applying for Early Entry to university (where students gain entry based on school recommendation) rather than solely the ATAR.

If students consider they have suffered long term educational disadvantage during their HSC year eg health or personal issues, then special provision via the various Access and Equity Schemes are available.
