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Principal's Message

Welcome to new and continuing parents - Welcome to all our parents for another exciting year in your children's education. We are looking forward to meeting new parents over the coming weeks. The first opportunity for you to get involved with Mudgee High School will be at **our first P&C meeting**. This will be held on Monday 25 February commencing at 7.00 pm. We meet in the school library; please enter via Horatio St. This first meeting is a great opportunity for us to make new parents welcome and so of course we would also like as many of our continuing parents to come along and get involved.

Annual Swimming Carnival - This week sees our first major event for the year. The annual swimming carnival will be held on Friday 8 February at Mudgee Pool. All years 7, 8 and 9 students will be attending and years 10, 11 and 12 students who register for an event. For year 7-9 this is instead of their normal school day and requirements for attendance do apply. For students in years 10-12 who do not pre-register for the carnival there will be normal school lessons and so all students are expected to attend school that day. Year 12 students participating in the fundraising must also register to attend the carnival. No student may be absent from either the carnival or school without a note explaining their absence. We have organised a canteen for the day but students are advised to bring other food and drinks as the canteen will be limited. Year 12 will be conducting their fundraising so request that students support their efforts by bringing whatever cash they can spare.

HSC Results – The Year 12 class of 2012 has continued the longstanding tradition of outstanding results in the Higher School Certificate Examinations.

This year 113 students completed their HSC at Mudgee High. The school was proud to be able to offer students 59 different HSC courses. Across all of their results there were 306 individual exam scores (60% of the total) on or above state average. There were 20 Band 6 results (top 10% of the state and a mark over 90) and 102 Band 5 results (top 20% of the state and a mark over 90). Twenty three per cent of all Mudgee High results were above the very meritorious score of 80. The vast majority of students have performed at a very high level in all their courses.

Individual excellence was achieved by – Tom Bambrick (2 Band 6 and 4 Band 5), Monique Bremner (6 Band 5), Henry Bryant (1 Band 6 and 5 Band 5), Nathan Chapman (1 Band 6 and 3 Band 5), Ben Cheetham (1 Band 6 and 5 Band 5), Karlee Farthing (6 Band 5), Sarah Fergus (2 Band 6 and 4 Band 5), Amy Harrington (1 Band 6 and 3 Band 5), Andre Jewell (2 Band 6 and 2 Band 5), Brittany Leven (5 Band 5), Alice Wisse (5 Band 6 and 2 Band 5) Many of our students gained early entry to their chosen university course based on their school marks. Over 60% of students were offered places at university. Several students have been awarded major scholarships, others have been offered places with a private provider, and a number have secured apprenticeships. Many others are working in casual jobs waiting on their university and/or TAFE commencing or have taken a gap year to ensure they have sufficient funds to go away to university or other courses.

MIRRI - Unfortunately we have not yet received the copies of the Mirri which we had to return in December. This publication is a fantastic memento of 2012 but the binding was poor so they were returned. As soon as the corrected copies arrive we will let parents know. Many have already purchased their copies and will be given a replacement. Year 12 also can collect their copy when they arrive. If you know a Year 12 student who is not in Mudgee when the Mirri is available to be picked up let us know and we can put one aside for them to pick up later.

Newsletters – A newsletter will be given to every student this week to ensure that all parents receive a copy. In future weeks they will be emailed or students may collect a copy at the office. (A slip is provided on the back page if you wish to supply us with your email address)

HSIE NEWS

Welcome back to all students and a special welcome to anyone who is new to the school in 2013.

Parents of students in Years 9 and 10 will notice a difference from previous years in the way the History and Geography curriculum is being delivered to students in 2013. The decision has been taken to semesterize the year 9 and 10 History and Geography courses. This means that students in Years 9 and 10 will study History and Geography for six periods a week but for two terms. Therefore if your student is studying Geography for the first two terms they will do History in the second half of the year and vice versa. Students will still be studying the subjects for the same number of hours over the semester as they were in 2012 and covering the same course content that has been delivered in previous years.

ENGLISH NEWS

New teachers: The English staff is welcoming two new members of staff. Mr Luke Golden is replacing Mrs Kirk while she is on maternity leave. Mr Golden has worked in English on a casual basis for some time and we are happy to have him full time. Mrs Amy Goodworth is joining us from Kandos High where she worked last year. Mrs Goodworth did her prac teaching at Mudgee High and her return is most welcome. Both Mr Golden and Mrs Goodworth are very dedicated and skilled new teachers and we are lucky to have them.

Peer tutoring: Once again Mudgee high will offer students the opportunity to take part in this worthwhile program. Year 10 students have been approached to become tutors. They will be trained in the processes of tutoring reading and then paired up with a student who needs help to become more confident with texts. Our experience is that students benefit enormously from this program, not just in reading fluency and comprehension but also in leadership and confidence. If you have a son or daughter in Year 10 who is interested, they should see Mrs Stead in the library to put their name down: students need to be competent, but not necessarily perfect, readers.

Debating: In 2012 Mudgee High had a very successful year in the Premier's Debating Challenge. Students who are interested in being part of a debating team this year should see Mrs Daniels or Miss Eslick in the English staffroom. When we know how many of you there are we will enter teams. Being part of the debating team involves travel away from school to compete with students from other towns. Debating is well recognised as being a very valuable activity for students. It not only develops skills in public speaking and the confidence associated with it, but also helps students to develop effective arguments and skills of persuasion. The demands of teamwork and quick thinking are also useful. We would like to see students involved in this challenge.
