It has been a great year so far for the Link Program. Students have taken part in a range of activities, from which they have gained worthwhile experiences.

The lucky students who gained one of the limited positions at TAFE have been working with their teachers to build a range of new skills. The Introduction to Basic Trade students have been learning about a range of practical applications such as cutting sheet metal. Meanwhile, the Beauty and Hair girls have made great progress, according to Janie Seymour, their teacher. She feels that many of them have great potential in this field.

Most of the students have, or currently are, engaged in work experience placements, gaining valuable first hand practical knowledge as well as an important edge when putting together a CV or job application. All students completed a work readiness program in Term One.

The students went to Dunn's Swamp in late Term One for a team building and physical exercise day. The mentor at that time, Elwyn Lang, was accompanied by Mr Bill Kempton from Mudgee High School, and a great day was enjoyed, along with activities designed to build on working with others for a common goal.

Another interesting event was a visit to the Property Shop. Staff explained the range of jobs, including reception, property management, sales and auction. We then participated in a mock auction, which was good fun, as students bid against each other to 'buy' a property in Gulgong.

We were sorry to farewell Elwyn Lang as our community mentor at the end of Term Two. Elwyn said that he had really enjoyed working with the students and they, in return, and formed a good relationship with him.

An extremely lucky 6 students (Kyle Peterson, Daniel Roth, Jamie Tuck-lee, Jessica Hardy, Swastika Nandini and Ben Endacott) attended a week long Defence Force Careers Week at the start of Term Three. Mr Laurie from Maths accompanied the group and by all accounts it was both great fun and a wonderful opportunity to learn about jobs in the Defence Forces. A huge highlight was attending the second State Of Origin football game – even though NSW lost. In Term Three, we have welcomed our new Community Mentor, David Payne. David has an excellent background for the position and is looking forward to working with the students.
