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# **Mathematics Workshops**

During the year a number of Mudgee High students have participated in workshops for Mathematics outside the normal school hours in order to strengthen student skills. Although most students have come from Year 12 others are most welcome.

Workshops will continue during term 3 and a one hour work session every Monday afternoon during Term 3 from 3.30pm to 4.30 pm has been organised. Extension students are continuing to attend tutorials on both Tuesday and Wednesday nights. The session has been created in order to strengthen students skills in the lead up to the HSC. It also provides students with assistance with more difficult work. It is hoped that students from all courses will take advantage of this extra time provided by the Mathematics staff.

Again students from any year experiencing difficulties or require further explanation on a concept are more than welcome.

#### **Australian Mathematics Competition**

Mudgee High School once again has a strong contingent of students entered for this prestigious competition. Held last week on Thursday August 1<sup>st</sup>, the competition gives students the opportunity to challenge themselves with some higher order thinking and logic skills.

This year we have 31 students over three different levels who have accepted the challenge.

The Mathematics department of Mudgee High School is proud of those who have accepted the challenge and look forward to receiving notification of their results.

#### Super Rule

The HSC is a demanding time for students and it is essential that students are well prepared for lessons with the right equipment. Students who are completing the HSC this year must have an approved scientific calculator. Students are asked to check with their teacher in case their calculator is not approved. Those students sitting the General Mathematics examinations can also take in an approved graphics calculator and we ask that students notify their teacher if they are intending to take such a calculator into the examination. Being unfamiliar with a calculator can severely affect a student's results.

Besides a rule students in the Mathematics and Extension Mathematics courses can purchase a mathematics template which has been approved for use in their examinations. The template is referred to as a Super Rule and can be purchased for \$11.60 from the school.

#### **Calculators**

**All** students in years 7 to 12 need to use calculators in their Mathematics classes. The Mathematics courses are designed to make use of calculator technology to assist students to develop more difficult concepts without becoming bogged down in manual calculations. Mental calculations skills are also practiced as part of the course.

It is important for students to have a calculator of the type approved by the Board of Studies. In the past some students have disadvantaged themselves by not practicing their skills on a calculator that they can use in their final exams. Students are advised to check with your Maths teacher that your calculator is an approved model.

Approved calculators can be purchased from the front office for \$17.00 which is cost price to us. If families have calculators which are no longer needed by ex-students they can be used. It is not necessary to buy the latest model. If students look after their calculator it will last throughout their time at school and beyond.



The three students Ben Reinhard, Sally Byrne and Georgia Williams who were selected for Director General for a Day have gained new feriends and confidence from their experience. They worked with a senior Departmental officer and shared ideas with the Minister Mr Piccoli. There were excellent embassadors for Mudgee High School.
