Principal's Message

We are looking forward to a big week especially for Year 12. On Tuesday they will play in the annual OZTAG match against the PCYC. The purpose of this match is to highlight the great work our police do in our community. It is also to build strong positive relations with young people by having a chance to interact with police in another setting. On Wednesday we will hold the annual staff v Year 12 soccer match. This tradition honours the memory of past student Billy Holland who was a great sportsman but tragically was killed very young. That evening Year 11 will host a Farewell Social for Year 12. Other years will also attend these events.

On Thursday Year 12 will hold Rainbow Day. This is an opportunity for the whole Mudgee community to get behind the charity drive. Year 12 have chosen the Mudgee Hospital and Head Space, a youth mental health organisation, as their charities. They will be running roadside collections from 7.30 am - 9.00 am around Mudgee township. Later that day they will run a fete for primary and high school students and then perform in a concert for the high school students. The final event for Year 12 will be their Formal Presentation on Friday commencing at 11.30 am. Parents are encouraged to attend this celebration of the achievements of Year 12 as the whole school acknowledges their contributions over the past six years to Mudgee High School the presentation will conclude by 1.30 pm.

Trial of Bring Your Own Device.

This week is the final week of the trail of students using their own devices, including mobile phones, iPods, iPads and laptops. Students have been trialling greater freedom to use their devices in breaks with the continuing restriction that use in class is at the discretion of the teacher. There were also some differences in the restrictions for seniors and juniors. We are beginning the process of evaluation of the trial and would like feedback from parents. Please complete the attached small survey and return to the office by the end of term. Your views are very important in ensuring we get the best data for the evaluation.

NB. During Term 4 students are NOT permitted to use their devices in breaks. THE TRIAL WAS A TRIAL and is over at the end of term 3. Once we have evaluated how it went decisions will be made whether the policy will be implemented for the start of 2014, any changes or adjustments needed and the impact of students using their devices in breaks. Please remind students that use of their devices during breaks in Term 4 may lead to confiscation. Any student needing to contact a parent can ask permission at the office and in most cases the student will be allowed to phone or text you. Parents are requested to make contact through the office with their children in term 4 as students will not be able to use their phones in breaks without coming to the office for permission.

ENGLISH FACULTY NEWS

Year Eleven have just completed their Preliminary exams. They will soon receive their exam results, enabling them to make final decisions about courses before beginning their year twelve studies next term.

Year Twelve are gearing up for Rainbow Day and the HSC. We wish them all the best for their exams and encourage them to keep writing essays to maximise their marks over the coming weeks. Many year twelve teachers have made themselves available to provide extra assistance to students and they should feel well supported as they approach their final exams.
