PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

HSC written examinations have continued this week and will do so until November 4. So far, so good with no major dramas to report... this is always a stressful time for students, their families and their teachers. Perhaps the best news has been the feel good comments of students upon exiting their examinations, declaring that they felt well prepared for what was asked of them.

This week's examinations have included or will include Biology, Hospitality, Automotive Studies, Extension 1 English, Agriculture, General Mathematics, Mathematics and Extension 2 Mathematics, Legal Studies, Chemistry, Community and Family Studies, and Software Design and Development... another huge week!

Last week I headed a selection panel that chose a new Deputy Principal for Mudgee High School. It would be fair to say that the selection process was not made easy by the stella nature of the candidature. It is interesting to consider that because Mudgee is a town of less than 10,000 and more than 100km from the nearest regional centre it is classified as "remote" which connotes thoughts of spinifex and desert sands. Yet as we all know, Mudgee is a great place in which to live. It would seem a great many other people outside of the town feel the same way and, as a result, many excellent applications are often submitted for the positions that become available.

This position was certainly one that did just that.

So, after deliberations that began with a half-day of shortlisting in the first week of school and concluded with a day of interviews and further deliberations that began at 8.15am and concluded at 5.15pm last Tuesday, the panel decided on its preferred candidate.

And although we are still in the 10 day appeal period, I think I can safely announce that the preferred candidate was Mr Richard Finter, who is currently the substantive Deputy Principal at Gulgong High School and who will begin at Mudgee High in 2016.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr David Tooney who has relieved in the position of Deputy Principal for all of this year. Mr Tooney has performed the role exceedingly well. We are all indebted to him for the professionalism he has brought to the role, his preparedness to tackle any issue and his willingness to continue in the role for the remainder of this year.

SCIENCE NEWS

YEAR 8

VALID, previously known as ESSA, is a statewide science assessment program based on the NSW Science Years 7-10 Syllabus, which mandates the teaching of science in contexts that assist students to see the relevance of science and to make meaning of scientific knowledge, understanding, skills, values and attitudes. It is mandatory for all Year 8 students in NSW government schools.

The VALID test is an interactive multimedia assessment. In 2015, it will occur between Monday 9 November and Friday 13 November. Mudgee High School Year 8 students will do this test on the 13th November 2015 and students are asked to bring their own earphones please.

Students are asked to demonstrate their:

- knowledge and understanding in science
- skills in planning and conducting investigations, including a simulated experiment
- skills in understanding and responding to a range of scientific information in a variety of media (including video, audio, animation graphics and text)
- skills in critical thinking and problem solving.

VALID online contains:

- three extended response tasks
- approximately 80 multiple choice and short response items.

The test results provide information about student achievements which are used to support teaching and learning programs.

Analysis of these results assists school planning and can be used by schools to monitor development of scientific knowledge, understanding, skills and attitudes through time.
