#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Tomorrow night – Tuesday 10/11, there will be an information evening for parents and students regarding *Japan 2017* – our proposed two week cultural visit to Japan in April, 2017. #### **JAPANESE**

#### HIRAGANA SKILLS (ひらかぎむ)

Year 7 students have been applying themselves to the task of learning Hiragana. This is the most basic of three writing systems in Japanese and can be used to write the entire language except for words of foreign origin. It consists of 46 main characters and all classes have been working through a variety of tasks designed to develop their recognition and writing skills. Students are particularly enjoying our game activities. Karuta, a card game like 'snap,' is proving very popular. We have been very impressed with the engagement of students in these lessons.

Learning to read and write using this script is guite an achievement and students deserve to be very proud of their

efforts. The focus in class now, is to continue to introduce the remaining characters in the chart and to reinforce those already learned. Students need to ensure they continue to revise the hiragana characters, on a regular basis at home, to cement their knowledge.

In upcoming weeks, Ms Date's and Ms Kim's classes will try their hand at SHOODO (Japanese calligraphy). Students will have an opportunity to test their skills at using traditional brushes and ink stones and writing on rice paper. They will also be practising their skills by reading some simple Japanese children's stories.



#### **VISIT FROM OUR FRIENDSHIP SCHOOLS**

Mudgee High School hosted another successful visit from our friendship schools in Japan. 18 students and 3 teachers from Suita Higashi High School, Ohkanmuri Senior High School and Hokusetsu-Tsubasa High School spent 11 nights with host families and enjoyed a full program of activities.

Having travelled from their rather hot and humid summer, the group found the cold weather of Mudgee a little difficult to adjust to but did not let it dampen their spirits. The school program included ESL lessons, class integration, a walk around the town of Mudgee, an excursion to Dubbo Zoo, a visit to the school farm, a visit to 5/6N at Mudgee Public School, sport activities and souvenir shopping at a Rotary sponsored gift shop.

On the middle weekend of their visit, a number of families made their way out to 'The Drip' for a bushwalk and picnic. Our Japanese guests never get to experience such beautiful bushland and they were particularly impressed by the ever changing scenery throughout the walk. Another unique experience for the students was our stunning night sky, littered with bright, shiny stars. Their gasps of wonderment serve to remind us that we really are blessed to live in such a gorgeous place.

The tour culminated in a farewell party for all host families and their new family members. The Japanese group entertained us with a traditional theatre demonstration, dance performances, some traditional songs and Japanese games. On the last day of their school visit, we hosted a 'cultural exchange', enjoying more games, singing and dancing.





#### **JAPAN TRIP 2017**

The time has come to start, in earnest to prepare for Mudgee High School's third visit to Japan. Ms Date and Ms Kim are inviting students from Year 9 to Year 12 (in 2017) to join them for a twelve day tour of Japan in April 2017 (school holidays after Term 1). Naturally, priority will be given to students studying Japanese as an elective. However, to assist with numbers, it may be possible for ex Japanese students or those who have hosted our inbound Japanese visitors to join us. To get the ball rolling we are holding a Parent/Student information evening this Tuesday, November 10th starting at 6pm in the school Library. (Please enter from Horatio Street). #### Whooping cough information for schools

There is an outbreak of whooping cough (pertussis) in NSW, mainly affecting school-aged children.

Coughing spreads the infection to others nearby. Whooping cough can spread to anyone at home, including younger brothers and sisters. Whooping cough can be especially dangerous for babies.

Whooping cough starts like a cold and progresses to bouts of coughing that can last for many weeks. The infection can occur even in fully-vaccinated children. Older children may just have a cough that is persistent and may be worse at night.

- Children with these symptoms should see a doctor.
- If your doctor diagnoses whooping cough in your school-aged child, please let the school know and keep your child at home until they have taken 5 days of antibiotics. Keep coughing children away from babies.
- Whooping cough vaccines give good protection against infection but immunity fades with time. Check that all
  your children are up to date with their vaccines, due at 6 weeks, 4 months, 6 months, 4 years and 12 years of
  age (offered to all Year 7 students through the NSW school-based vaccination program). A booster is also
  recommended at 18 months of age.

A booster dose of vaccine is also recommended for adults that are in contact with young children, such as school staff and parents. Pregnant women are recommended to have a booster dose during each pregnancy and this is funded by NSW Health. Those who are new parents or carers of babies should consult their general practitioner about appropriate immunisation.

### Year 10 'LOVE BITES' Parent Information

The Love Bites sexual assault and domestic violence prevention program is going to be run for Year 10 in conjunction with the PD/H/PE core subject. Outlined below is some information for you on the program. If you have any further questions about the program, please contact Karen Quinn at Mudgee High School.

#### What is Love Bites?

- Love Bites is an extremely successful, school-based sexual assault, domestic and family violence prevention program that has evolved on the Mid Coast of NSW
- Over 10,000 high school students throughout NSW have participated in this interactive and innovative program aimed at Year 10 students.

The Love Bites Program consists of two interactive workshops on sexual assault and family / domestic violence and then workshops that consolidate the information from the morning workshops by working alongside the students to produce artworks that will then be printed on posters, coasters and resources for the students and community.

The artworks, music and radio advertisements from all students are used to develop a local campaign to challenge violence against women in the community. This campaign is led and delivered by young people.

The Love Bites program presents a consistent approach to the issues of violence against women and children that is firmly focused on factual statistical information that consistently confirm that sexual assault and domestic violence are gender issues as women are overwhelmingly the victims of men's violence and that men are overwhelmingly the perpetrators of this violence. Love Bites advocates that young people can change these statistics and can make different choices, resolve issues in non-violent ways and can develop respectful relationships.

The program will involve all of Year 10 who will be placed into three groups. Each group will then participate in a one day workshop that will take place over three days in Week 6, Term 4.

Group 1: Monday 16<sup>th</sup> November Group 2: Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> November Group 3: Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> November

Students will need to bring their own morning tea but lunch will be provided. If your student has any special dietary requirements or questions, please see Mrs Quinn by Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> November.
