PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Welcome to Week 2. It would appear that the cool weather is already kicking in!

A big thank you to all of those Mudgee students, parents and carers who braved the cold to attend the ANZAC Day dawn service on Saturday, as well as to those students who represented the school in the parade. We may have some work to do on what moving in columns looks like, but it was great to see so many volunteers on the ground.

This week, Year 11 half-yearly examinations are taking place. It may seem odd having "half-yearlies" in April, but when you consider the Preliminary HSC only goes for three terms, it begins to make some sense. It would be easy to say "good luck" to Year 11, but luck only plays a small role in examinations of any kind. What really pays off is study and practice. Get these things right and the luck will come by the bucket load.

A heads up that next Tuesday, 5th May, there will be an information evening for parents of students in Year 6 who will make the transition from primary to high school at the end of the year. I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Mr Andrew Laurie on his appointment to the role of Year Adviser to next year's Year 7 – the class of 2021. The role of Year Adviser is not an easy one, so it was heartening that several teachers at Mudgee High were prepared to go the extra yards and submitted EOIs for the position. Mr Laurie brings six years teaching experience and a number of years as an active member of the Learning Support Team – a kind of Year Adviser's apprenticeship – to the role and will undoubtedly make an excellent Year Adviser.

On Wednesday evening, 6^{th} May, there will be a Senior Students (Years 11 and 12) study skills and information evening from 6.30 pm - 7.30 pm in Performance Centre. This is always a worthwhile evening and can go some way to relieving some of the anxiety that surrounds studying for the HSC.

Building works in the area formerly known as the IQ Café are going full steam ahead and we would appear to be on track for a Week 8 completion, giving Mudgee High School an extra, enclosed learning space. Recent works in the support playground area have transformed the covered learning area from a mud-tinged swimming pool in inclement weather into a usable facility in all kinds of weather. Mr Whittington's fish arrived from the Narrabri fish hatchery last week, bringing the aquaponics project just that little bit closer to start-up. The area where the aquaponics will be established has also been cleared and levelled in anticipation. The interest from students in the project to date has been very encouraging.

NAPLAN TESTS 2015

In May 2015 the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in all government and non-government schools.

A letter providing parents and guardians with information regarding NAPLAN 2015 was sent home with students in Week 10 of Term 1.

The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.

Background information (student name, gender, date of birth, language background and Aboriginality) will be collected as part of the National Assessment Program. This information is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that every student's right to privacy is maintained. The tests will be conducted across Australia for all students from 12 – 14 May 2015.

MHS Sheep making an impression

Mudgee High School has exhibited its White Suffolk sheep at the Mudgee Show, Dunedoo Show and Sydney Show so far this year.

The next and final event is the Dubbo Show, which will conclude the sheep showing for 2015.

Curtis Wright, Tim Cheetham, Emily Blackwell, Alysha Papps, Miranda Riley and Grace Pearce helped to show sheep at the Mudgee Show. There was some tough competition but MHS managed to come away with the Reserve Champion Ewe.

Curtis, Emily, Alysha and Brody Lesson then attended the Dunedoo Show. There was a wide range of competition, with some exhibitors travelling up to 4 hours to attend.



Again, MHS managed to bring home the Reserve Champion ribbon with the same Ewe.



Tim, Curtis and Nick Pearce then exhibited at the Sydney Royal Easter Show. This was the first year MHS has exhibited at Sydney and it took a great deal of dedication and hard work, but the results made the whole journey worthwhile.

In the schools classes, the MHS ram placed first in the Milk Tooth Ram class from 16 exhibits, outclassing the likes of high performing Agricultural Schools such as Yanco Agricultural, St Gregs College, Macarthur Anglican, St Lawrences and more. This ram then went on to win Reserve Champion Ram, only to be beaten by St Gregs older Corriedale ram, who had more size and class about him because of his age.



The ewes performed well amongst stiff competition. One ewe placed 4th from 23 exhibits in the Short Wool Milk Tooth Ewe class. The other 2 ewes placed 8th from 15 exhibits in the Pen of Two Ewes class.

Tim managed to place 6th from 30 competitors in the Junior Handlers competition to cap off the experience. The students' behaviour was exceptional, even under stressful and draining conditions.

The school is exhibiting at Dubbo State Sheep Show in May, and will then focus on breeding more exceptional progeny to carry the stud forward in the years to come.

- Swimming with the VERY rarely seen thresher sharks and 5mm pygmy seahorses in the Philippines
- Wrecks, reefs and hearing earthquakes underwater in Vanuatu
- Diving the depths of the Blue Hole in the Caribbean
- Swimming with humpback whales in Tonga, and
- Diving in New Zealand, Thailand and many more places.



This 4m tiger shark swam over the head of Mr Willetts and Bridget Harvey as they patted the sharks' belly!!




The thresher shark is easily identified by the enormously long tail which accounts for half the

shark's entire length. It only comes to diveable depths at dawn to be cleaned by small cleaner fish.

In January 2016, some past Marine Studies and Mudgee High students will be travelling to one of the **TOP** 3 dive destinations in the world! **PALAU** in Micronesia (Carolinas Island Group) is recognised as having 2 or 3 of the TOP 20 recognised dives in the world!!! In a remote area of the Pacific Ocean, close to the deepest part of the world – the Mariana Trench, this beautiful island chain has some of the best big fish action in the world, coupled with shallow ship and plane wrecks from WW 2, underwater caves with stalagmites and the curious jelly fish lake.
