PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

July's P&C meeting is on this evening, as mentioned in last week's newsletter.

One of the things I will be reporting on this evening are my findings re uniform supplies in town. At the June meeting, I offered to see if there existed uniform out there that would be resistant to the occasional Antarctic blasts we are subject to in the Central West. For about 6-8 weeks each year – this time of year – the occasional note flutters across my desk declaring:

On Wednesday 29 of July, MHS year 7 students will participate in the *Aim Higher* program.


Aim Higher is a dynamic, hard hitting 60 minute high energy "magazine style" interactive performance that uses humour, music, multi-media and popular culture


