PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

The last week of Term 3 and the last days of formal schooling for Year 12 have arrived; a coincidental and annual event.

And what does this week look like? An ecstasy of fumbling – final summaries, class farewells, seeking signatures for university applications, sourcing fridges to keep wares cool for Rainbow Day stalls, baking, tie-dying, video making, speech writing... It's all Go! Go! Go!

Rainbow Day – now there's a powerful statement of all that is good in public education in Mudgee, New South Wales.

While many schools endure "muck up" days – bizarre rituals in which the very people who have been developed and supported so as to become the fine young adults they are turn on the very place that has done so much for them; literally biting the hand that has fed – Mudgee High School enjoys what is almost certainly the best Year 12 swansong of any school in the entire country.

Our Year 12s have for more than a decade used their time not to plan wanton acts of vandalism but rather rallied the resources of the local community – you good people reading this spiel – and sought to make better the institutions so many of us rely on that make us a cohesive society rather than an assortment of disconnected individuals.
