PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Pinking Up Mudgee High

Students GoMAD in Aboriginal Garden

On Wednesday, 12 October a number of students from The Leadership Group and The Aboriginal Roll Call rolled up their sleeves to clean out and plant 100 native seedlings in the Aboriginal Garden as part of the GoMAD leadership initiative which was initially overseen by Mrs Emma Nichols who is currently on Maternity Leave . They were: - Will Evans, Dylan Hayes, Paige Martin, Alice Roach, Josh Scarbrow-Hills, Alex Sutherland, Harrison Newton, Isabella Shearman, Ruby Forrest, Cody Arnol and Phillip Arnol.

The students were capably supervised by Mr Jamie Leven and Mr Sam Loveday. Mr Leven reported that the students worked exceptionally well the whole day and the finished product looks magnificent. It will look even better when the seedlings take root and grow to their expected sizes.

This was stage one of a program which will eventually see a winding pathway through the area, paved with crushed sandstone or some other suitable material. The old iron bark tree from the main quad, which had to be removed for safety reasons, provided the bulk of the wood chippings required.



Later in the term, members of the GoMAD Leadership group will make their way to Gulgong to participate in a two day celebration of all of the GoMAD activities in the Western Region, a fitting reward for all of their hard work and preparation of this school improvement initiative.
