## **AUSTRALIAN MATHEMATICS COMPETITION**

This is a test of mathematical, logical and problem solving skills involving 25 multiple choice and 5 open ended questions. All students are encouraged to enter this competition, especially those with talent in the subject or who enjoy a challenge. There are 3 different levels in the high school section, although students are only compared to those in their own year group. All entrants receive a certificate of participation, with higher credentials for different levels of success also on offer (great certificates for resumes and CV's). Exceptionally talented students may also be in line for some of the many cash prizes available.

Although the competition is on later in the year, we need to send our entries in the first week of Term 2. To enter this competition, students will need to pay \$5.60 to the front office by Friday 29<sup>th</sup> April (Friday week 1). 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All the school who were there came up to present their handprints to Ms Momal Union and our year 4-5 students sang for everyone. It was a fantastic experience.


Miss orlisa told us that Mudgee High School was her old school and she was really happy that you joined the project and we hope you will join other projects in the future.
