The program is designed to inspire students to build upon their potential to succeed in years 10, 11 and 12 and expose them to a wide range of study and career options that exist for HSC graduates.


There is no cost to apply. Successful applicants are required to pay a fee of \$50 (including GST) to accept their offer of a place at the Summer School. This covers all accommodation, all meals and excursions for the duration of the program. The programs are supported by Commonwealth Equity funds enabling the cost to individuals to be substantially subsidised.

"TOGETHER FOR HUMANITY" INCLUSIVITY CONFERENCE PARLIAMENT HOUSE SYDNEY

Recently, 8 students travelled to Sydney as guests of "Together for Humanity" for a conference on Inclusivity. "Together for Humanity" is a non-government organisation which works to foster harmony and respect in the community. Students representing 15 Secondary and Primary Schools, both public and faith based, were required to make a two minute presentation on any issue which could result in people being discriminated against. Schools made presentations on disability, gender, race, and religion. Mudgee High's presentation was a short two minute video on the challenges faced by those with disabilities.

Mudgee High's presentation, along with two others was chosen to be presented later that day to dignitaries at Parliament House. The audience included both Federal and State MPs, people representing various ethnic and religious groups and ABC executives. They engaged in an open forum with all the students about the issues raised in the student presentations. The dignitaries were highly impressed with Mudgee High's presentation.


