We certainly sang the national anthem. For a time, we called on God to save our gracious and noble queen – from what I never knew – and send her victorious, happy and glorious, to reign over us for as long as possible. Later we rejoiced in the fact that we lived in a country where we were all "young and free" in a home "girt by sea". The "joyful strains" were not always obvious in the delivery, but we all knew the first verse and regularly delivered it without hands on hearts.

Make no mistake, this "meme" is a dog-whistle. It is a political message put out there by people seemingly unaware of the second verse of *Advance Australia Fair*, which tells, "... those who've come across the seas/ We've boundless plains to share". It masquerades as a call to arms to defend a cultural practice that never existed.

What has this to do with school? Plenty. We teach the kids in our care to be aware of how those who tell us things often position us to share a particular world view. We teach the kids in our care to be prepared to fact check. We teach the kids in our care to be prepared to question the source. What works in History, Business Studies, Science and English works in life too. Question the source. And this is a questionable nonsense.

# TRY A TRADE ACTIVITY

On Thursday 26 May and Friday 27 May 2016 a Try a Trade event will be held at Mudgee High School. Participating students will be involved in practical activities relating to a range of trades.

This 'hands on' activity will almost certainly allow students to gain realistic insight into a variety of trades. There will also be an opportunity to discuss career options with the 'tradies'. Some of the trades available over the 2 days include horticulture, mechanics, carpentry and beauty therapy.

Students will need to wear covered shoes for the activities and will be provided relevant PPE.

This event will be held in the MHS gymnasium. There is no cost to students and they will be timetabled to participate in Try a Trade during their allocated double period on the day.

# **ATHLETICS CARNIVAL 2016**

The athletics carnival is on Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> May at Walkers Field. This is a normal school day and attendance is required. Students will need to bring their ID cards to swipe in at the beginning of the day and events will start at 9am.

The events held on the day will include 100m, 200m, Long Jump, High Jump, Discus, Shotput, Javelin and novelties (the 400m and 3000m will be held at 8:30am before the carnival). The idea that underpins the carnival is participation, having fun, getting involved and in showing house spirit. Students are encouraged to participate in all events and to get dressed up in House colours.

A canteen will be running on the day and Yr 12 will once again be providing goodies for their fundraising. Bus companies will be diverted to Walkers Oval and students will need to be at the carnival by 8.55am.




