### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Fans of the Terminator franchise, that collection of films that tells the story of a plucky bunch of American-speaking individuals pitted against a cybernetic killing machine with a distinctly Teutonic accent, could be forgiven for thinking *The Rise of the Machines Judgement Day* has finally arrived after the announcement by ACARA that NAPLAN writing will be marked by robots.

As a former HSC marker and Senior Marker – a leader of marking teams – of both Standard and Advanced English, I think I'm in a pretty solid position to argue the case against such a move. Instead, I have provided below an article from *Education Review* which does it quite well:

## The case against automated NAPLAN marking

Concern surrounds a move towards the automated marking of NAPLAN English exams.

The Independent Education Union Australia this week released a statement opposing the proposal, which it says will undermine teacher professionalism, promote poor practice, and induce worry in parents.

Secretary John Quessy said plans by the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) to use automated marking for NAPLAN exams have also come under fire from Dr Les Perelman, an international expert in writing assessment from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Dr Perelman was commissioned by the NSW Teachers Federation to review ACARA's plans and said the idea of automated marking was "flawed".

Quessy said the Independent Education Union was concerned about the growing commercial influence of companies such as Pearson Australia – which would administer the automated marking – on education and NAPLAN.

There was also concern over a lack of consultation with teachers, with plans in place to introduce the automated marking system before 2020.

"Students and parents would have a reasonable expectation that a trained human – a teacher – would mark their written responses," Quessy said.

"The HSC has been developed over 50 years and is always double marked by two expert teachers.

"NAPLAN is undermining tried and tested educational practices which rely on the experience, judgment and professionalism of trained teachers, in favour of a machine marking. One would wonder where this will end?"

When both the union representing teachers in private schools and the union representing the largest group of public teachers in Australia, as well as an expert from MIT, see this move as a terribly flawed one, alarm bells should begin to sound.

## Year 10 'LOVE BITES' Parent Information

The Love Bites sexual assault and domestic violence prevention program will run for Year 10 in conjunction with the PD/H/PE core subject. Outlined below is some information on the program. #### What is Love Bites?

- Love Bites is an extremely successful, school based sexual assault, domestic and family violence prevention program that evolved on the Mid Coast of NSW
- Over 10,000 high school students throughout NSW have participated in this interactive and innovative program aimed at Year 10 students

The Love Bites Program consists of two interactive workshops on sexual assault and family/domestic violence and then workshops that consolidate the information from the morning workshops by working alongside the students to produce artworks that will then be printed on posters and resources for the students and community.

The artworks, music and radio advertisements from all students are used to develop a local campaign to challenge violence against women in the community. This campaign is led and delivered by young people.

The Love Bites program presents a consistent approach to the issues of violence against women and children that is firmly focused on factual statistical information that consistently confirm that sexual assault and domestic violence are gender issues as women are overwhelmingly the victims of men's violence and that men are overwhelmingly the perpetrators of this violence. Love Bites advocates that young people can change these statistics and can make different choices, resolve issues in non-violent ways and can develop respectful relationships.

The program will involve all of Year 10 who will be placed into three groups. Each group will then participate in a one day workshop that will take place over three days in Week 7, Term 4.

Group 1: Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November Group 2: Tuesday 21st November Group 3: Wednesday 22nd November

Students will need to bring their own morning tea but lunch will be provided. If your student has any special dietary requirements or questions, please see Mrs Quinn by Wednesday 8th November.
