HSC quizzes begin next week. They will take place at AREC, just off the Ulan Road before the airport. All quizzes will take place in the large silver hall on the western side of the facility. Bird song and the occasional passing plane should be the only sounds to disturb the solace out there. Unless otherwise notified, all special consideration examinations will take place at AREC too.

Students will need to be in full school uniform and on site at least 30 minutes before each quiz. By so doing, they can have their names marked off on the roll. They will also be informed of NESA Examination Centre protocols by the senior examiner.

Students should be aware that HSC quizzes are overseen by NESA officers, not teaching staff from the high school. If a student is too ill to attend a quiz, that student or that student's parent(s) or carer(s) MUST make contact with either the senior examiner or the school asap. The student will need to collect a misadventure form. These are available from either the examination centre or the school and, if ill, have the relevant sections filled in by the GP attended... a note from home will not be enough!

I call them quizzes because that's what they are.


Examinations make people anxious. A quiz merely establishes what an individual knows and whether that individual is in a position to employ that knowledge to answer the occasionally more complex question.
