KARATE KID II

7B's William Drakeford, who was mentioned in last week's newsletter as about to head off to compete in karate at the 2017 National All Styles Australian Championships at Olympic Park Sydney, has come home a winner.

William's main event for the NAS National Titles was continuous sparring. He had a convincing win with all three judges awarding him 1st in the first round. This win qualified him to contest the final, which he again won convincingly.

William now holds the title of 2017 Australian Champion 12 to 14 year old boys 10th to 6th Kyu continuous sparring.

The next success for William came in the NSW State Team for point sparring 2017 National Championship: State vs State. NSW beat Victoria 5 nil to go into the final against Queensland. At a two all draw, NSW and Queensland had the last contest, which was declared five-all at final time.

The competition then went into extra time.

The first contestant to score in extra time would win the title and, unfortunately for William's team, that point went to Queensland. William and his team earned the 2nd Place medal for State vs State Team Point Sparring 2017, Junior Male 12-14 years.

It would be fair to say that William's parents are proud of his success, as are his coaches, Geoff and Jacquie Spice, and of course his teachers and friends here at Mudgee High School.

Not too shabby an outcome at all for a young bloke in Year 7 contesting his first Australian Championships in what is a very demanding sport.

Aboriginal Education WUDHAGARAGARRA AWARDS




The Wudhagaragarra Awards celebrate and recognise innovation, excellence and achievement in Aboriginal education in New South Wales' public schools and communities. Awards are presented to selected high-achieving Aboriginal students, Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal teachers, staff, community members, and schools.

This year from Mudgee High School, Azrun Paulson was nominated for the *Academic Excellence Award - Higher School Certificate*. This award is presented to Aboriginal students who have demonstrated outstanding academic achievement in any HSC subject undertaken in 2017 and who display a positive attitude to school and ongoing education.

Azrun was nominated for the outstanding work she put into her Personal Interest Project for Society and Culture. Her commitment to the research process and the academic rigour with which she in-

vested into her work was exemplary. This major work was completed over three school terms and required students to work in a selfdirected manner, with personal drive and ambition. It is not an easy task and certainly cannot be thrown together at the last minute. Azrun rose to the challenge from the very beginning and did not waiver from her path. She was committed to creating a body of work of which she can be very proud.





Azrun attended the award ceremony on Thursday 7th December in Dubbo. She was accompanied by her father, Mr Brett Paulson and her Society & Culture teacher, Miss Windeyer.

A screening of all the animations will occur at the Town Hall Theatre from 5pm on Tuesday 23 January.


