FROM THE OFFICE

Absences: One day - advise by phone or note on return to be given to Roll call Teacher or Office.

2 or more days – need written note. Ask for an absence booklet from the Office OR if you are registered for the **Parent Portal**, go to http://web1.mudgee-h.schools.nsw.edu.au/portal

This way you can access your students' absences and update online.

If you would like to register, contact the school and we will send login details to your email address.

<u>Leave/appointments</u>: Please complete absence note or write note. Student is to present the note to the Office before Roll Call. The student will be given a printed leave slip and will meet parent in foyer (or arranged spot) at the given time.

<u>Last minute leave/appointments</u>: We realise that some appointments are arranged at the last minute. Please contact the Office to arrange these appointments.

<u>Payments</u>: Student fees letters will be mailed in the near future for Semester 1. You can pay fees online http://www.mudgee-h.schools.nsw.edu.au/ Click on "Make a payment" and follow the prompts. Alternatively, payments may be made to the office. Cash/cheque or EFTPOS is acceptable.

<u>Sick Students</u>: When students feel unwell at school, the correct procedure is for them to see a teacher. The teacher will give them a note to give to the office staff. Office staff will then ring home. If your child rings you direct, please let them know that they need to follow the school procedures.

Excursions: Close by dates for payments and notes. These time lines are in place so we are able to finalise payments and bookings, etc.. If you are unable to meet these deadlines, please notify the school prior to the close by date so we can accommodate the student participating. If you are unable to meet the deadline due to financial reasons, Student Assistance may be available, but conditions apply. Once again this needs to be applied for before the close by date. Deposits/instalments may also be made to secure a student's place on an excursion but final payment must be made by the due by date.

INFORMATION FOR YEAR 7 2017 REPRESENTATIVE SPORT AT MHS

School teams

At Mudgee High we offer students the opportunity to represent in sport at both a junior and senior (Open) level. There are many different sports available to you, ranging from team to individual, and from traditional sports such as cricket and football to the less traditional sports such as lawn bowls, futsal and equestrian.

Each sport will have a teacher who is responsible for coaching and managing the students involved. The information for each sport is usually communicated to you via the daily announcements which are read during roll call. Teachers will advertise training days and trials for their sport, usually early in Term 1, so listen out for some great opportunities!

Western Area Trials - Sports

A number of sports conduct selection trials for students who wish to represent Western Area. These sports include: softball, cricket, golf, hockey, netball, rugby league, rugby union, football (soccer), squash, tennis and many more...

Year 7 students may need to take into consideration that the majority of these sports are Open teams (7-12), not junior (e.g. U/15's) therefore making selection more difficult competing against older students. I would still encourage students to attend trials as this gives students valuable experience and alerts area managers to their interest in competing at a higher level.

Most sports have 'trial days' where you need to complete nomination form and consent forms (signed by the Principal) and arrange your own way to venues. Information about these trial days are given to the various coaches or are advertised in the daily announcements. It is important to get nomination forms in on time or you will miss out!

SWIMMING

If you wish to swim at the **Western Area Trials (Thursday 9th March 2017)**, you need to collect a nomination/information form from Mr Smith in the TAS staffroom. This usually needs to be **completed by early February**. Students will need to make their own way to this venue. YOU MUST GET YOUR NOMINATION FORM IN BY THE DUE DATE. **Note: MHS Carnival is on Friday 24th February.**

If students' progress from WA trials they compete at CHS Swimming at CHS Swimming (SOPAC) Sat 1ST April-Tuesday 4TH April.

CROSS COUNTRY

Each year group from Years 7-9 (and nominated participants 10-12) run a cross country course (usually in sport time, 23rd-25th May with a date TBC). From these results, students may wish to compete at Western Area if they are suitable.

The Western Area Cross Country is being held on Wednesday 14^H June. CHS Cross Country will be at Eastern Creek on 21ST July.

ATHLETICS

The school's carnival is held on **May 19TH at Walkers Oval**. Again students must nominate if they wish to compete at the **Western Area Trials 28th July Term 3 at Dubbo**. Those students who gain selection in the Western Area team compete in the **CHS Carnival at Homebush September 6th-8th**

ATHLETES WITH A DISABILITY (AWD)

Frequently asked questions

Which will be better for me - PVC or School Drive Subsidy?

It depends on:

- · How many children you have on the scheme.
- The type of school they attend (boarding school, day school or mini-school).
- · The distance you need to drive
- If you have children to add to your school trips in the fiture

You should consider staying on the PVC subsidy if you're receiving a PVC subsidy for more than one child.



What are the School Drive Subsidy rates?

You can find the latest rates for the School Drive Subsidy and the PVC at transport.nsw.gov.au/schooldrive

The deadline for new applications for the existing PVC subsidy is 20 December 2016.

Keep in mind, if you stay on the current PVC subsidy, you won't be able to add new students after 17 January 2017 without switching all the existing PVC students to the new School Drive Subsidy.







What's happening?

From 20 December 2016, the Private Vehicle Conveyance (PVC) subsidy will be progressively phased out and replaced with the new School Drive Subsidy.

This change will make it fairer for everyone who drives their children to school or to the nearest public transport location.

If you're a parent or guardian currently receiving the PVC subsidy, you can choose to stay on it or switch to the new School Drive Subsidy after 17 January 2017.

What are the main changes?

If you're driving one or more eligible students from the same household to the nearest public transport pick up point or to school, the new School Drive Subsidy will be paid 'per trip' (for the complete school trip). This 'per trip' payment is different from the current PVC subsidy. which is paid 'per student'.

Other differences include:

- A flat per kilometre rate (indexed annually to the cost of living) will apply under the School Drive Subsidy, unlike the flat payment per distance band in the current PVC subsidy.
- The requirement to do a special return trip each morning and afternoon will be removed.
- The 300km per trip payment cap will be removed.
- The limit of eight trips per year for distance education students to attend mini-schools during term time will be removed.
- The PVC subsidy rates will remain at 2017 levels in 2018 and beyond.
- Payments to third parties will stop (e.g. payments to a bus operator hired by parents from pooled PVC subsidy payments).

Note, you can't be on two schemes at the same time. If you add new students after 17 January 2017, **all** eligible students will automatically go onto the new School Drive Subsidy, including existing PVC subsidy students.

What do I need to do?

If you want to stay on the existing PVC subsidy, you don't need to do anything.

Assuming the school trip doesn't change, your payments will continue for all existing students until they leave school or until you need to re-apply because a student is moving up to Year 7 at high school.

If the school trip changes because you move homes or the student changes schools, you will need to re-apply under the new School Drive Subsidy.

Remember, you can't re-apply for the PVC subsidy after 20 December 2016, but you can switch to the new School Drive Subsidy at any time after 17 January 2017.

If you want to switch to the new School Drive Subsidy, apply online at transport.nsw.gov.au/schooldrive

Just like the PVC subsidy, payments will be made twice a year, around August and February, based on the student's school attendance for the preceding semester.

The online application process only takes about 10-15 minutes to complete.

If you don't have access to the internet, feel free to call **131 500** for assistance.

After you've applied and been approved for the School Drive Subsidy, payments will be made automatically into your bank account twice a year.

You won't have to re-apply until a student reaches the end of Year 6, or until you next update any details — such as a change of school, school trip or address.

What happens if I stay on PVC now but want to add a new child later?

For new eligible students, you can either

- Add the new student into the new School Drive Subsidy and also switch the existing students to the new scheme, or:
- Stay on the current PVC subsidy where existing students are covered, but not add any new students and not receive any additional subsidy.

What are the distance requirements under the School Drive Subsidy?
