- encouraging you to increase physical activity, especially within two hours of waking up.







1. Eligibility

2. FAQ's

Each scholarship program has a list of FAQ's designed to assist you. Read through the FAQ's on the scholarship programs that you are interested in to see if your questions can be answered before applying.

3. Begin application

- a. Go to the <u>program webpage</u> to start your application.
- b. Click on 'apply now' in your selected program and you will be redirected to the 'I work for NSW' website where you can begin your application.
- c. Select the scholarship you would like to apply for. If you are eligible for more than one scholarship you can submit multiple applications.
- d. You will be asked to provide:
 - i. Personal details including contact details and employment history
 - ii. University course details either the course you are currently studying or the intended course of study if you are a HSC student or a career changer
 - iii. Supporting statement the reasons you would like to become a teacher in a NSW public school and how your personal qualities will enhance your effectiveness as a teacher
 - iv. Supporting documents you will need to upload the following supporting documents before submitting your final application:

Outstanding documents submitted after the closing date must be certified, scanned and submitted to the Scholarships Team by email at scholarships@det.nsw.edu.au.

Applications close **14 September 2018**. Please refer to the timeline schedule that will be emailed to you once you submit your application.




