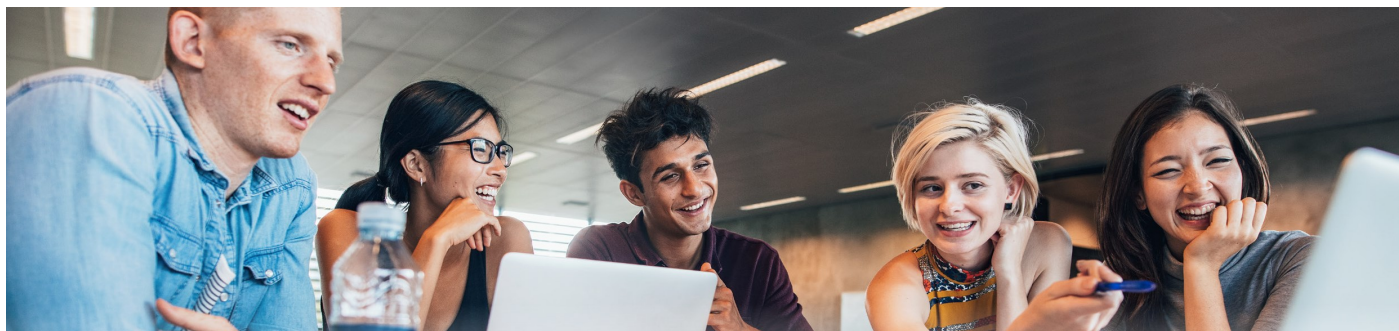

2. FAQ's

Each scholarship program has a list of FAQ's designed to assist you. Read through the FAQ's on the [scholarship programs](#) that you are interested in to see if your questions can be answered before applying.

3. Begin application

- Go to the [program webpage](#) to start your application.
- Click on 'apply now' in your selected program and you will be redirected to the 'I work for NSW' website where you can begin your application.
- Select the scholarship you would like to apply for. If you are eligible for more than one scholarship you can submit multiple applications.
- You will be asked to provide:
 - Personal details - including contact details and employment history
 - University course details – either the course you are currently studying or the intended course of study if you are a HSC student or a career changer
 - Supporting statement - the reasons you would like to become a teacher in a NSW public school and how your personal qualities will enhance your effectiveness as a teacher
 - Supporting documents - you will need to upload the following supporting documents before submitting your final application:

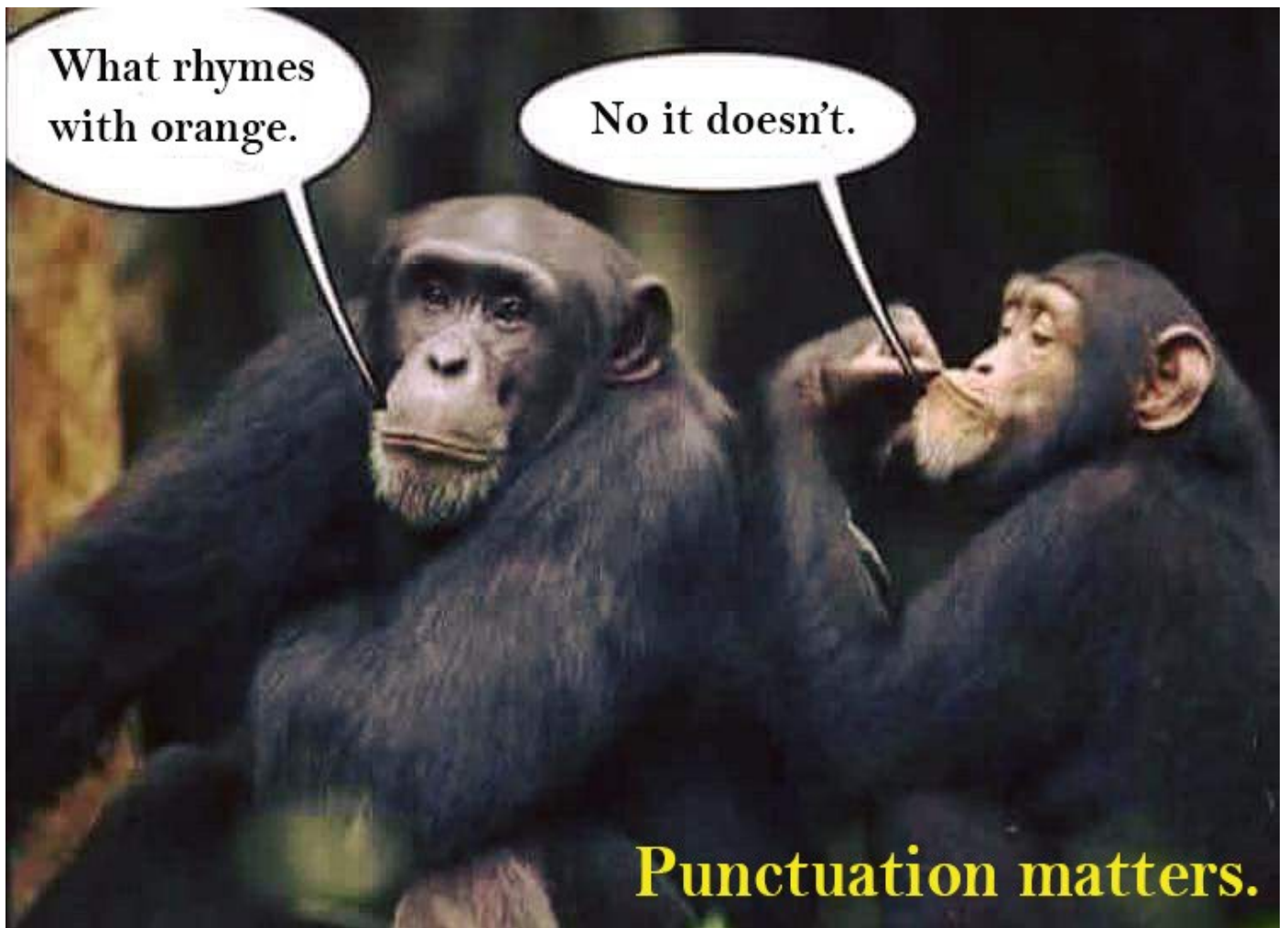
