YEAR 12 STUDENT HOSPITALITY EXPERIENCE AT THE NOVOTEL WOLLONGONG

Last week, Mudgee High School Year 12 Hospitality students took part in the Student Hospitality Experience at the Novotel Wollongong. This program gave these students a unique insight into the hospitality industry, which will be invaluable for their HSC preparation. Students travelled to Wollongong where they undertook activities that focused on gaining a better understanding of the hospitality industry.

Student travelled down on Tuesday afternoon checking into the hotel before enjoying dinner. After Breakfast students listened to a presentation on working in the hospitality Industry. This was followed by a Tour of the Hotel and a practical session on making Mocktails. After lunch, students listened to a presentation on sustainably in Hospitality. The next day, students dressed in their Chefs whites for a session in the Novotel's pastry Chefs before more practical sessions on coffee making and waiting techniques. Staying in the hotel as a guest and dining at the hotel's restaurant for all meals enabled students an insight into the standard of service and accommodation required in a four star hospitality establishment.

The Student Hospitality Experience at the Novotel Wollongong increased the student's depth of understanding of the current trends, culinary techniques and vocational opportunities within the hospitality Industry. This excursion was made possible through the fundraising efforts of the Year 12 students operating the Inner Quad Café for senior students and teachers over the past year.











Year 7 Mathematics and Technology

The integrated unit using Mathematics and Technology is continuing for a number of Year 7 Mathematics classes. This semester, the focus skills being covered in this Stem initiative will include Spreadsheets, Area and Programming, with an overall theme of Waste Management.

Senior Exams

Year 12 students are currently preparing for their Trial HSC Examinations in General 1 and 2 Mathematics, Mathematics, Extension 1 and Extension 2. Students have been completing content and practising questions from past HSC papers in order to improve their ability to recall and use important concepts at the level that is required in their final HSC Examinations. Year 11 will be preparing for their exams later in the term.

It has been pleasing to see that there are growing numbers of senior students who have taken advantage of the tutorial room on Monday afternoons. This has enabled many senior students to seek the assistance of several teachers.

Once again, Mudgee High School will have a strong representation in this demanding competition.



When you register on JobJump you will receive the News on the Careers your son/daughter likes sent to your home email address. Plus you will be able to use all parts of the JobJump website to help you plan and assist your son/daughter in achieving their Career dreams.

To register with JobJump, go to the front screen of the website at www.jobjump.com.au

Then in the top right hand side click 'I'm New'

To begin, **type the first couple of letters** of your school's name in to the first white box and when the full name of your school appears in blue on the screen, simply click on it and it will enter into the first box. Then enter in the next box your School's Password exactly as you see it here with no spaces and all lower case letters:

This is perfect to help your son/daughter in their career options since you know what subjects they enjoy and in which they do well. Ask your Careers Adviser for this.


FREE WEBINAR: 'Navigating your teen's mental health' By The Black Dog Institute


