Library News

Another busy term is nearly at an end, as we find ourselves in Week 10.

The Library continues to be the focus of our whole school minimal supervision lessons. The state wide teacher shortage and winter 'flu season' has necessitated that classes that cannot be covered by a single class teacher are supervised in individual learning in a mix of computerbased and traditional pen and paper lessons within our learning spaces. A team effort of highly competent and professional teaching casuals, full-time and SLSO staff have made sure students have continued to learn in a meaningful way during what is a very difficult time in education generally. All our library resources have been concentrated on making sure this facilitation can occur as seamlessly as possible in a supportive and well equipped setting.

This term has also seen all our Distance Education students complete their end of course examinations in various subjects. Our HSC cohort have completed their Trial HSC in Japanese, Agriculture, Business Studies, English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EALD) and Community and Family Studies (CAFS) subjects in Week 6 of term. Year 11 Distance Education students completed their end of course Preliminary examinations in Week 9 in Japanese and Earth and Environmental Science. Our Aurora students also sat yearly examinations in Science last week.


While all of the above has taken place, the Library has continued to provide a place for after school faculty professional learning and staff meetings to occur, visits from Distance Education teachers from across the state, and outside organisation meetings with students.

Our fiction reading section has also undergone a new round of updated novels that have been added to our collection this term.

All of this is occurring on top of our regular provision of providing library services during all school breaks and a place for senior students to work during their study periods.

How our library is utilised at Mudgee High makes a mockery of any statement that alludes to the notion that 'School libraries are dead and have no place within modern learning frameworks'. Recent times would suggest they are more relevant than ever when educational resources are stretched, and the expectation is that students will take more personal responsibility for their own learning.

In the library, we look forward to Term 4 and the challenges and successes it will bring.



Maths faculty news

Holidays again! Time to check your child's bag and replenish equipment. We have noticed a considerable rise in the number of students needing to borrow basic equipment, especially pens and calculators. Workbooks are becoming scrappy and potentially near the end of their usable life. We urge parents and carers to please make sure you are sending your child to school with multiple pens, 30 cm rule and calculator in a pencil case, and a specific Mathematics workbook (preferably 5 mm grid books, but lined books are okay too).

Maths would like to extend a big congratulations to all Year 11 students who have just completed their yearly examinations.


With HSC examinations looming, we wish Year 12 the best of luck and positive vibes for a successful examination period. Mathematics classes have been provided with past papers as well as extra practice papers to help with studying. Keep an eye on the Google classrooms for supplementary materials and opportunities to catch up with your teacher to get extra support.

Helpful Maths Study Tips for HSC students.

- If you haven't already, create summary notes for each topic/chapter. As you go through past papers and you come across tricky questions, use your summary notes (or add to your notes as you go).
- Know your reference sheet inside and out! It is your one consistent in the examination. Know what is on it and how to use it.
- Practise, practise, practise. Draw on a variety of resources, don't just go over the same questions. Sometimes problems are given in different ways and formats.
- Be prepared have your pens, calculator and a rule ready to go.
- Eat well and get plenty of sleep the night before
- Use your reading time to plan how you are going to tackle the paper.
- Breathe and read each question thoroughly, highlighting and annotating all the key information before starting each question.
