# Principal's message

#### **Better late**

The Week 3 newsletter is running a little late.

And for good reason!

I trust we will be forgiven.

#### **Performance**

Performance is a funny word. It can refer to the routine action of performing a specific task or function. Insert the word 'high' in front of it and now everyone is looking for the extra, like the 0-100 km/h performance of a sports car.

Performance can also refer to the act of presenting something like a play or concert. In this case, performance as entertainment.

Those engaged in a performance are, as the word makes clear, obliged to 'perform'.

From an educational perspective, student performance is the primary focus. At the heart of school education lies student skill development and the acquisition of knowledge.

In more recent years, there has been a shift in the educational performance focus to 'teacher performance'. Implicit in this move has been the notion that student results will improve if the teacher out the front is more entertaining... an edutainer! The argument would appear to be that the classroom is a stage requiring a talented individual to hold court on that stage.

Teachers certainly a need to be across the craft of teaching. Very few people enter teaching to bore the life out of the young people with whom they will work. They enter teaching as they are passionate about what it is they do and wish to share that passion with others.

Edutaining – teaching as a kind of performance art – is exhausting. Being compelled to 'perform' for several hours each day, five days a week can really smash the throat and is a guaranteed source of mental fatigue.

# Change of school uniform commencing in 2024

Mudgee High School's uniform was reviewed in conjunction with the school's Parents & Citizens committee in 2023.

A transition period to implement the new uniform changes will be in place for at least the next two years, over 2024 and 2025.

This means items of uniform that students currently have can continue to be worn for the rest of their useful life.

The review sought to update, in conjunction with our suppliers, uniform items that can be reliably and consistently stocked, with the addition of a number of new items of winter uniform being added.

The only major change to the uniform that will commence in 2024 is the introduction of the navy and red polo shirt for the junior school (Years 7-10).

Our two local uniform suppliers, Mudgee Embroidery and Uniforms and Brand Me Mudgee, are now in the process of obtaining stock of these shirts, should families wish to start transitioning to the new uniform for the start of 2024.

## 2024 School Bus Passes

#### Information for Parents and Carers

#### Is your child eligible for free bus travel to and from school?

All bus passes will be distributed to eligible students via mail early next year so if your child is enrolled in a local school, please note the following:

- Students going into Kindergarten, Year 3 and Year 7 must apply for a new pass.
- If you have moved address or schools you must 'update existing details'.
- If you are unsure whether or not your child has a current bus pass, please contact our office on 6372 2489.
- To travel on our bus service, students MUST present their bus pass to the driver morning and afternoon. If they are ineligible or do not have a pass, they can pay a fare.

Select 'Schools' tab in top header then select either 'Apply for a New Pass' or 'Update Existing Details'. Fill in the application form for each child and you will be notified of their eligibility via email from Transport NSW.





The Year 12 Farewell is one of the most significant occasions on our school calendar, celebrating the final step in the school education of Year 12 students. It is one to be shared by the students, their parents and loved ones.

The organisation of the evening and ticket purchasing is outlined below:

- Meet at Putta Bucca House for photos with photographer at a time 4.30 pm (photo packages to be sent home prior to bring filled out with money on the day).
- The Farewell commences at 7.00 pm and concludes at approximately 10.00 pm. Please note that the doors will close at 7.15 pm and reopen after the formal introduction of students at 7.45 pm.
- Dress is ladies "after 5" and gents "tie".
- The Year 12 Farewell is an **alcohol-free event**. Anyone bringing alcohol onto the premises will be asked to leave the function.


