## Principal's message

## **Testing Times**

This past week, Years 7 and 9 have completed statewide literacy and numeracy testing.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) runs earlier these days and provides the school with a snapshot of student performance that can be compared with the performance of students across the state and indeed the country.

Mrs Burke, our Head Teacher Wellbeing, had oversight of this huge undertaking. Nearly 300 of our students were involved. Mrs Burke was impressed with the serious and thoughtful manner in which the students approached the tests, so much so that she made a point of telling the whole school at our whole-school assembly on Wednesday.

114 of our Year 10 students undertook the Minimum Standards literacy and numeracy test on Wednesday. This test was introduced by Adrian Piccoli when he was the Minister for Education (2011 to 2017). The test allows students planning to leave school before achieving their HSC an online means by which to gain a record of their level of literacy and numeracy. A pass in the test is also necessary to achieve a Higher School Certificate. All but three of our students achieved the standard this week. All students from Year 10 onwards are afforded a number of opportunities to complete the test, as well as assistance in the Learning Centre to master its demands.

Mrs Burke was also full of praise for our Year 10 students and the way in which the students conducted themselves in this test.

## **Student Representative Council Induction**

The world is truly run by those who turn up.

It was good to see so many students nominate for Student Representative Council this year. Young people prepared to "turn up" and take on the challenges of student service and leadership.

It was great to have all the successful candidates inducted into the Student Representative Council on Tuesday.

The members of the Student Representative Council have their own roll call. Each member of the Council serves as conduit for their respective Year group, channelling concerns and suggestions to the Council's patron, Mrs Zhang, and schools captains, who meet with me every Tuesday at recess.

This day is an annual celebration of the mathematical constant  $\pi$ . Pi Day is observed on March 14 because 3, 1, and 4 are the first three significant figures of  $\pi$ .

NESA approved scientific calculators can be purchased from the front office at cost price. The school offers two options, an Abacus calculator for \$20 and a Casio calculator for \$30.

Students in all years are encouraged to attend each day with a well-equipped pencil case, including a calculator, multiple pens (including blue/black and red), pencil, eraser, sharpener and a 30 cm rule.


### Maths assistance

Students are welcome to come up to B9/B10 from 3:25 pm to ask a few questions or stay for up to an hour to further develop their skills.

It provides pathway options into Years 11 and 12 at Mudgee High School, TAFE, an apprenticeship/traineeship or traditional employment.

## What is the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge?

The PRC is a statewide Challenge that encourages students to develop a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students and enables them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition, but a challenge to encourage each student to read, to read more, and to read more widely.

All students who complete the challenge, and have their reading record validated by the school's PRC coordinator, will receive a certificate signed by the Premier of NSW.

## How many books do students need to read?

Students in Years 3 to 10 are challenged to read 20 books independently. At least 10 of these books must be from the relevant Challenge booklists, and up to 10 books can be personal choice books.

If a book is from an approved PRC series, students can enter up to 5 books as Challenge books, and can read up to 10 other books from the same series as Personal Choice books. More information on the rules of the Challenge can be found on the <a href="PRC website">PRC website</a>.

Books must be added to a student's online reading record by **Friday 23 August 2024** in order for their reading record to be validated and receive a certificate.

## How do students log their reading?

Students can access the PRC's <u>Student Experience site</u> using their DoE username and password, or can log into the site via the Student Portal. A video guide explaining how to use the Student Experience site can be found here.

Students may also record their reading on the Personal Reading Log and submit it to the PRC Coordinator, Ms Tetley, by 23 August 2024. Ms Tetley will complete the reading log on the students' behalf.

## How can students find books on the NSW PRC challenge lists?

Ms Tetley can provide students with a printout of the list so that they can do a search in the School's Library to locate any copies. All of the relevant book lists for this year's competition have been set up on Google classroom.

Midwestern Regional Council – Mudgee Library also has a system organised for easy identification of books on the list. They have a PRC sticker on them and are identified in their online catalogue.

Ms Tetley is the PRC Coordinator for Mudgee High School's entrants this year.

## A quick guide for logging books:

- Log into the Student experience site using your DoE student username and password.
- Use the blue search bar to search for books you have read.



If the title appears, click "Add to Reading Log" to add it as a PRC book.



• If the title does not appear, you will need to enter it as a personal choice book.

## To enter a personal choice book:

- Click on the icon in the top right-hand corner. Home Rules Log out
- Click on "My reading log".



• Fill in the book details under the "Add a Personal Choice book" field and click "add".



If you have any issues with logging books, please speak to Ms Tetley.

Ms Tetley has set up a google classroom for the participants. There are lots of helpful areas on it

The classroom code is: **76xurfw**.



## **NSW Education Parent App**

The NSW Education Parent App has several new features making it even easier for parents and carers to stay in touch with the latest news, access learning resources, and get emergency updates from their child's school.

The new-look app is designed to streamline communication between schools and parents and carers with features such as push notifications to your phone so you never miss any important news or an upcoming event. Users will also now be able to receive emergency updates such as school closures, and access learning and enrolment resources.

The app was developed and is endorsed by the department, free for schools and parents and carers to use, and is synced with the School Website Service (SWS).
