Principal's message

School Development Day – Tuesday 30 April

School development days are used to build on the knowledge and skills of our teachers, the school's leadership team and its administrative support staff through targeted professional learning.

Professional learning is important in building the capabilities of Mudgee High's staff to ensure that members of that staff continue to be highly skilled and professional in what they do, and to support the department's vision for NSW public education to be Australia's best education system and one of the finest in the world.

Very occasionally, schools need to move their school development days to access resources in high demand and scarce supply. Mudgee High is in such a position.

The NSW Department of Education makes allowance for specific school variations to development day scheduling, specifically:

Variations of school development days

Schools that wish to vary the date of a school development day can consult with their school community and advise their Directors, Educational Leadership.

Mudgee High's Director, Educational Leadership and the school's P&C have both been consulted about moving the school development day scheduled for Thursday 19 December to Tuesday 30 April. The move has been made necessary so that the school can access day-long, face-to-face support from its professional partner organisation, Real Schools. This is all part of Mudgee High's 'restorative practices' implementation and the establishment of more consistent and student-supportive practice across the school.

The school has the support of the P&C in moving the school development day. As a result, all students will return to school on Wednesday 1 May, their first day of Term 2. Term 4 will now conclude for all students, Years 7-11, on Thursday 19 December.

Parent/teacher evening – Thursday 4 April

Parent/teacher evenings provide an opportunity to visit the school and discover what your child has been studying in their classes and how well they have been engaged with that study, as well as what you may be able to do to assist them to progress further.

Parent/Teacher evening for Years 7 to 12

Parent/teacher evenings are an opportunity to find out what and how well your children have been doing at school. It is also an opportunity to discover ways in which you may be able to assist your children to improve.

In 2024 we are trialling a new look format for parent/teacher interviews. The key changes are:

- Two parent/teacher interview evenings for the year one in Term 1 and one in Term 3.
- Each evening has been expanded by one hour, running from 3:45 pm to 7:45 pm.
- Interviews will be scheduled at a maximum of 5 minutes
- Each evening will cater for ALL Year groups, 7 to12.

We are very happy to be able to welcome you to our first round of parent/teacher interviews being held on Thursday 4 April, from 3:45 pm to 7:45 pm.

Interview bookings can be made via our online booking system in the Sentral parent portal. Interview booking time slots will be released to parents from 9 am Wednesday 27 March and close at 5 pm Wednesday 3 April. If you cannot access the Sentral parent portal, please contact the school for assistance. You will need to provide a valid email address to establish a portal account. Interviews must be booked online.

We have no doubt you understand that opening each of the evenings to all Year groups increases the potential for our teachers to be fully booked. As a result, we have determined that NO bookings will be made on the night. **All bookings must be made online, via the Sentral Portal.** Please contact the front office and our administrative staff if you need assistance with bookings. Teachers have been allocated a 15 minute meal break for the evening. Systems will be in place, at the Concierge Desk, in the event that any teacher is absent for the evening.

The Learning and Support Teachers, Student Support Officer (Wellbeing) and Careers Adviser will also be available on the night. No appointments are necessary. Please feel free to drop by, say hello and discuss your child's learning and support needs.

Interviews will occur in the gymnasium. Our concierge will be able to assist you in finding your appointments. All faculty areas will be clearly signposted. Entry to the school will be via the Denison Street gate.

We look forward to seeing you again or perhaps meeting you for the first time.

Years 7 and 10 vaccinations

In 2024, parents can continue to provide consent online for their child's school vaccinations.

The following vaccines are offered free to students at school:

- Year 7 diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (dTpa) and human papillomavirus (HPV)
- Year 10 meningococcal ACWY vaccine

Vaccination Dates:

- Year 7 Monday 6 May
- Year 10 Tuesday 7 May

Vaccination will only be provided at school if consent has been received.

To provide online consent for vaccination, parents/carers will need:

- Their Service NSW log-in details, or to create an account with Service NSW if you don't already have one.
- Medicare details for parents/carers and their child.

To complete online consent for your child's school vaccinations visit:

1. Follow the steps to log in to your existing Service NSW account. This is the same account you may already use to renew your driver's licence. If you don't have a Service NSW account, refer to Service NSW to create one.

- 2. Update or confirm your personal details in Service NSW as required.
- 3. Complete the School Vaccination Consent Form for your child/ren. You will need to:
 - Enter your child's personal details.
 - Provide the Medicare card details for you and your child.
 - Read the linked Parent Information Sheet and privacy statement.
- 4. Provide consent.

If you or your child do not have a Medicare card, consent can still be provided by requesting a

paper-based consent form directly from the school. Please contact Mrs Robyn Burke.
