New addition to the Sentral Parent Portal - Sentral Finance

The way business is done at school is about to change for the better.

The school's financial systems will soon migrate to Sentral Finance. As a result, Sentral's systems will be offline from **Monday 4 March** until **Tuesday 12 March**. During this transition period, the 'make a payment' option on the school website will be unavailable. You will still be able to make payments through the school office. Only online payments will be affected.

After the migration, the *Sentral for Parents* app will allow parents and carers to monitor their children more simply and efficiently at school. The app will also provide numerous smart features, allowing parents to; receive messages and notifications from teachers; report absences; make payments for school activities and more.

The Sentral for Parents app will help parents and carers stay connected and informed.

Sentral has introduced a new module which offers parents and carers an easy and convenient way to make payments and manage permissions.

Parents and carers will now be able to sign permission notes and make payments at the same time to provide an even more efficient way of handling their child's school finances.

What is the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge?

The PRC is a statewide Challenge that encourages students to develop a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students and enables them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition, but a challenge to encourage each student to read, to read more, and to read more widely.

All students who complete the challenge, and have their reading record validated by the school's PRC coordinator, will receive a certificate signed by the Premier of NSW.

How many books do students need to read?

Students in Years 3 to 10 are challenged to read 20 books independently. At least 10 of these books must be from the relevant Challenge booklists, and up to 10 books can be personal choice books.

If a book is from an approved PRC series, students can enter up to 5 books as Challenge books, and can read up to 10 other books from the same series as Personal Choice books. More information on the rules of the Challenge can be found on the PRC website.

Books must be added to a student's online reading record by **Friday 23 August 2024** in order for their reading record to be validated and receive a certificate.

How do students log their reading?

Students can access the PRC's <u>Student Experience site</u> using their DoE username and password, or can log into the site via the Student Portal. A video guide explaining how to use the Student Experience site can be found here.

Students may also record their reading on the Personal Reading Log and submit it to the PRC Coordinator, Ms Tetley, by 23 August 2024. Ms Tetley will complete the reading log on the students' behalf.

How can students find books on the NSW PRC challenge lists?

Ms Tetley can provide students with a printout of the list so that they can do a search in the School's Library to locate any copies. All of the relevant book lists for this year's competition have been set up on Google classroom.

Midwestern Regional Council – Mudgee Library also has a system organised for easy identification of books on the list. They have a PRC sticker on them and are identified in their online catalogue.

Ms Tetley is the PRC Coordinator for Mudgee High School's entrants this year.

A quick guide for logging books:

- Log into the Student experience site using your DoE student username and password.
- Use the blue search bar to search for books you have read.



If the title appears, click "Add to Reading Log" to add it as a PRC book.




• If the title does not appear, you will need to enter it as a personal choice book.

To enter a personal choice book:

- Click on the icon in the top right-hand corner. Home Rules Log out
- Click on "My reading log".



• Fill in the book details under the "Add a Personal Choice book" field and click "add".



If you have any issues with logging books, please speak to Ms Tetley.

Ms Tetley has set up a google classroom for the participants. There are lots of helpful areas on it

The classroom code is: **76xurfw**.

A solid start saw Chelsea Mottershead taking two wickets in her opening over, leaving Dunedoo 2-3 after the second over. Dunedoo settled in and Mudgee's many new and beginner bowlers had a turn, which saw some valuable runs added to the board for Dunedoo. Mudgee broke the partnership with a run out thrown by Chelsea and taken at the keeper's end by Cathy Mottershead.

Mudgee chipped away at the other wickets with April Robeson taking a catch at wicket keeper from Emily Stone's good length bowling. This was followed by another run out, this time a direct hit by Chelsea Mottershead. Charlie Wallace took a wicket off her bowling (caught by Chelsea), another run out by Evie Vitnell's fielding to April and final wickets were taken by Cathy who finished with 2-6 from her two overs. NAPLAN

National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy Information for parents and carers

- All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in Australia do NAPLAN tests in March each year.
- NAPLAN tests students' skills in reading, writing and maths.
- The test questions are presented in Standard Australian English dialect.
- Students read some of the questions and listen to others with headphones.
- The tests will get easier or harder, depending on how students are going in the test.
- Students do four different tests. The names of the four tests are:



- Students in Year 3 will do the Writing test using pencil and paper. Year 3 students will answer the other test questions on the computer.
- Students in Years 5, 7 and 9 will answer all their test guestions on computers.
- Teachers will help students get ready for NAPLAN tests.
- Schools will get their students' results. The school will then give parents/carers a report showing their own child's results.
- Parents/carers can talk to the teacher about these results.
- NAPLAN shows how students are going all over Australia. People who work in the Australian Government, state and territory education authorities and schools use NAPLAN results. The results let them see which schools are doing well and which schools might need help.

Talk to your teacher if you have any questions about your child doing the tests.

Parent/carer consent for exemption or withdrawal

Every year the **National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)** assesses the literacy and numeracy skills of students in Australia.

All students in **Years 3, 5, 7 and 9** who are enrolled at a NSW school are expected to participate in NAPLAN unless they are withdrawn or exempt.

Criteria for withdrawal

Students may be withdrawn from NAPLAN tests at the request of their parent/carer. Withdrawals are intended to address issues such as religious beliefs and philosophical objections to testing.

Criteria for exemption

- Students with a language background other than English, who arrived from overseas and have been attending school in Australia for less than a year before the test, should be given the opportunity to participate but may be exempt.
- Students with significant intellectual disability and/or significant comorbidity that severely limit their capacity to participate in the test, even with adjustments, may be exempt.

Exemption and withdrawal both require parent/carer consent. This consent form should be completed and filed at the school for auditing purposes by 23 February 2024.
