## Charged up, ready for action

Cooler Classrooms is coming to Mudgee High. The successful tenderers for the Mudgee High project were announced on Thursday 8 February. Those same successful tenderers were on site on Friday 1 March.

The Cooler Classrooms Program has been an ambitious plan since its beginning in 2018. Ambitious because the timeframe given was five years.

The program when initiated, and as explained by the Department of Education, looked like this:

environments for our students and deliver benefits beyond air cooling. These benefits include better air quality and comfort and increased awareness of sustainability and energy use...

Cooler Classrooms funds the installation of air conditioning in classrooms and libraries for schools that:

- have a mean maximum January temperature of 30 degrees and above where there is currently no air conditioning
- need to replace existing air conditioning units.

More than 900 of NSW's 2200+ schools were identified as fitting the criteria; Mudgee High was one of those schools.

We may not have made it into the glorious window that was the five-year plan, but the problems presented by our site have made the program's implementation a little more complex than most. The most pressing complexity has been the absence of sufficient power.

Last year, solar panels were installed on the top of B Block to assist in the cost of running the new install. This year, in what has been presented as a 36-week plan, the power upgrade necessary will be established and all classrooms will receive reverse-cycle air conditioning.

As stated, the work is meant to be completed within 36 weeks of the tender being accepted. Completion within that timeframe is without doubt an impressive target, made all the more ambitious by the fact that Australia is virtually at the end of the world supply chain for much of the manufactured equipment that will be used in this build.

Here's hoping it is completed on time, ready for next summer.



# New addition to the Sentral Parent Portal - Sentral Finance

The way business is done at school is about to change for the better.

The school's financial systems will soon migrate to Sentral Finance. As a result, Sentral's systems will be offline from **Monday 4 March** until **Tuesday 12 March**. During this transition period, the 'make a payment' option on the school website will be unavailable. You will still be able to make payments through the school office. Only online payments will be affected.

After the migration, the *Sentral for Parents* app will allow parents and carers to monitor their children more simply and efficiently at school. The app will also provide numerous smart features, allowing parents to; receive messages and notifications from teachers; report absences; make payments for school activities and more.

The Sentral for Parents app will help parents and carers stay connected and informed.

Sentral has introduced a new module which offers parents and carers an easy and convenient way to make payments and manage permissions.

Parents and carers will now be able to sign permission notes and make payments at the same time to provide an even more efficient way of handling their child's school finances.

# **Introducing the HSIE Faculty 2024**

The HSIE faculty at Mudgee High School has hit the ground running to take on a jam-packed 2024 school year!

Much discussion has taken place in the staffroom already this year about how impressed we are with classes settling into routines and embracing the wonderful worlds of History and Geography. In particular, a special shout out must go to Year 11 students who have been regular recipients of such commendations in these discussions.

The key learning area of *Human Society and Its Environment* (HSIE) offers a range of subject areas and opportunities for students to connect with the wider world. Students in Year 7 start this journey by spending their first high school year looking at an introduction to Geography and then follow this up in Year 8 with a year of History. Once students are in Stage 5, one semester covers the Mandatory Geography course and, the other, Mandatory History in Years 9 and 10, respectively. Students in Years 8, 9 and 10 are also provided with opportunities to explore elective courses in Commerce. Additionally, many of our senior students are involved in subjects such as Ancient History, Modern History, Business Studies, Legal Studies, Economics, and Society and Culture.

At the end of 2023, the faculty spent some time planning for the year ahead. Among this work was included a whole faculty check in as to what we want our students to appreciate and embody by the time they leave our HSIE subjects. Words such as *empowered, curious, respectful* and *empathetic* drove most of the brainstorming. It is hoped that by exposing our students to a number of real-world issues, that we can do just that. We also thank our students' parents who are always such great advocates for our subjects.

This year, the faculty welcomes a new member of staff to the team. Toby Harbison has joined us from Newcastle and has already done an outstanding job as a beginning teacher. We hope the Mudgee community welcome him with the same warmth and generosity in which the HSIE faculty at MHS has done. Making up the rest of our dedicated team are Helen Dziura, Rhys Kable, Emma Love, Kieran McHugh and Melinda Wade.

We look forward to continuing to work with Mudgee's young people in helping shape them into well-informed and passionate individuals.

This is the preference for digital submissions. However, work may be handed in on paper. Please do not assume that everything must be digital.

If your child is unable to meet the due date for an assessment task, they will need to complete an application for Special Consideration. These forms can be collected from the HSIE staffroom. It is the responsibility of the student to collect this form, complete it and return it to the Head Teacher of HSIE or their classroom teacher. In the event of a sudden absence, perhaps the result of illness or misadventure, the form can be completed after the due date. In all other circumstances, application for Special Consideration must be completed in advance of the due date.

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge is now open and Mudgee High School is excited to be participating!

# What is the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge?

The PRC is a statewide Challenge that encourages students to develop a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students and enables them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition, but a challenge to encourage each student to read, to read more, and to read more widely.

All students who complete the challenge, and have their reading record validated by the school's PRC coordinator, will receive a certificate signed by the Premier of NSW.

### How many books do students need to read?

Students in Years 3 to 10 are challenged to read 20 books independently. At least 10 of these books must be from the relevant Challenge booklists, and up to 10 books can be personal choice books.

If a book is from an approved PRC series, students can enter up to 5 books as Challenge books, and can read up to 10 other books from the same series as Personal Choice books. More information on the rules of the Challenge can be found on the <u>PRC website</u>.

Books must be added to a student's online reading record by **Friday 23 August 2024** in order for their reading record to be validated and receive a certificate.

## How do students log their reading?

Students can access the PRC's <u>Student Experience site</u> using their DoE username and password, or can log into the site via the Student Portal. A video guide explaining how to use the Student Experience site can be found <u>here</u>.

Students may also record their reading on the Personal Reading Log and submit it to the PRC Coordinator, Ms Tetley, by 23 August 2024. Ms Tetley will complete the reading log on the students' behalf.

### How can students find books on the NSW PRC challenge lists?

Ms Tetley can provide students with a printout of the list so that they can do a search in the School's Library to locate any copies. All of the relevant book lists for this year's competition have been set up on Google classroom.

Midwestern Regional Council – Mudgee Library also has a system organised for easy identification of books on the list. They have a PRC sticker on them and are identified in their online catalogue.

Ms Tetley is the PRC Coordinator for Mudgee High School's entrants this year.




